# COMMENCEMENT CEREMONIES

*The audience is requested to remain until the conclusion of the ceremonies.*

The exercises of the one hundred seventy-ninth annual Commencement are enacted today at Indiana University Bloomington. The counterpart of the pageantry enacted each year on campuses all over the world, it is the solemn climax and recognition of the graduates' years of study and preparation for responsibility.

To help spectators understand the significance of the ceremonies, the following description is furnished.

## PROCESSION

The grand marshal leads the procession, bearing the ceremonial Mace, emblematic of the authority of the state and university, and attired in a white brocade gown with panels trimmed in red velvet and a gold IU seal. A white brocade cap with gold metallic tassel is worn, and a gold satin shoulder sash with gold tassels. The head marshals wear black gowns with cream chevrons and panels edged in red, and black caps trimmed in cream with gold tassels. Other marshals wear shoulder sashes of various colors and designs.

Led by the school marshals and faculty, the candidates march behind the identification banners of the respective schools that recommended them for their degrees:

The climax of the processional brings to the platform the trustees of the university, the deans of the various schools, honorary degree recipients, state officials, university officers,

and finally the president of the university. As his badge of office, the president wears a jewel, emblematic of the history of the state and the university.

The trustees of the university can be identified by their red gowns, which have red velvet panels and red velvet chevrons on the sleeves. The panels and chevrons are outlined in cream, and an Indiana University seal appears on the left panel. The trustees wear black caps trimmed in cream with gold metallic tassels.

## ACADEMIC ATTIRE

All candidates for degrees and those who hold these degrees, including university officials and faculty and visiting dignitaries, are attired in traditional cap and gown. The basic color for most caps and gowns is formal black, except for those of the associate degree candidates, who wear gray caps and gowns. Recipients of different degrees wear distinctive tassels on their caps (the flat, square caps are called mortarboards) and hoods of various hues draped down the backs of the gowns.

## CAPS

Candidates for degrees wear the regulation cap with the tassel color appropriate to the school or division from which they are being graduated, with the exception of those who already hold doctoral degrees, who wear gold tassels.

## GOWNS AND STOLES

The bachelor's and associate's gowns have a closed front and open sleeves. Candidates for bachelor's and associate degrees also wear stoles. The master's gown has extremely long, closed sleeves, from which the arms extend through a slit at the wrist; the end of the sleeve is square, with an arc cut away just above the bottom. The doctor's gown has velvet panels down the front, and voluminous bell-shaped sleeves on which there are three velvet bars. The velvet is usually black, but may be blue for philosophy or green for medicine and optometry.

## HOODS

The bachelor's hood is worn only by those who already hold bachelor's degrees. It is rather short, with a narrow velvet edging of the appropriate color (see list of tassels) and a lining in the color or colors of the institution—crimson at Indiana.

The master's hood is considerably longer, has a wider velvet edging, and exposes more of the lining.

The doctor's hood is easily recognized by the width of the velvet edging, the wide panels at either side, the greater length, and the full exposure of the lining. The colors of the edging most frequently seen are royal blue for philosophy, green for medicine, royal purple for laws, light blue for education, and aqua for optometry; the colors for the honorary doctoral degrees are royal purple for Doctor of Laws, white for Doctor of Humane Letters, and golden yellow for Doctor of Science.

## HONORS

Students who have been tentatively selected to receive their degrees with honors are entitled to wear the fourragère, cream and crimson cords worn from the left shoulder, during the Commencement ceremony. Cream and crimson cords indicate highest distinction; cream cords indicate high distinction; crimson cords indicate distinction. Honors are awarded by a vote of the various faculties, and the fourragères are provided by the university.

The white tab under the cap button on certain law candidates indicates their selection by the Order of the Coif, a scholastic honor society. Law candidates who have tentatively received honors also wear the fourragère.

The gold medallion on a cream and crimson cord indicates the candidates graduating from the Hutton Honors College. Hutton Honors College

candidates who have tentatively received honors also wear the fourragère.

The appropriate recognition is recorded on the individual's diploma as a permanent testimonial of achievement.

## SYMBOLS

Traditional in all formal ceremonies of Indiana University are the Mace, symbol of authority; the Jewel of the Office, emblematic of the Office of the President; and the Collar of the Jewel of Office. The first is carried in academic procession by the grand marshal, and the last two are worn by the president. In design and ornamentation they represent significant events in the history of the state of Indiana and of the university.

The treasured symbols were presented to the university by its chapters of the Miami Triad in celebrating their centennials. The Jewel of Office was presented by Beta Theta Pi in 1945; the Mace was given by Phi Delta Theta in 1949; and the Collar of the Jewel of Office by Sigma Chi in 1958.

## THE HISTORY OF ACADEMIC ATTIRE

Academic costume of today has a history of nearly eight centuries. In medieval Europe, all townspeople—men and women—wore long, flowing robes and gowns. The materials and colors varied according to the wealth and rank of the individual and were governed by royal decree. Gradually, there developed distinctive gowns for the various professions, trades, and guilds.

Students in the medieval universities of Paris, Bologna, Oxford, and Cambridge organized themselves into guilds. Their usual garb, a long gown, was necessary for warmth in the unheated buildings. Scholars, generally members of church orders, wore these robes and also hoods to protect their shaved heads. Later, skullcaps were worn on the head, and the hood became a cape that could be pulled over the head in unpleasant weather. As additional universities were founded, distinctive forms of the gown and hood were adapted by their faculties for bachelors (apprentices of arts), masters (teachers), and doctors (teachers who had completed postgraduate studies). The variations appeared mostly in the hood and were regulated by strict rules. Tailors who departed from the authorized design could be punished. When caps and hats came into fashion in the fifteenth century, the hoods became ornamental, draped over the shoulders and down the back.

The academic hat was adapted from the headdress of the ordinary people. It was first worn as a symbol of the master's degree and existed in various forms. Some caps were stiff, some soft, some square, some round with a tuft in the center. The tassel of today is an elaboration of the tuft. The mortarboard style comes to us from Oxford University.

When academic costume came to America in 1754, styles were quite varied. In Europe they still are; however, in our country, usage has been standardized by the Intercollegiate Code of Academic Costume.

**PUBLIC TELEPHONES**

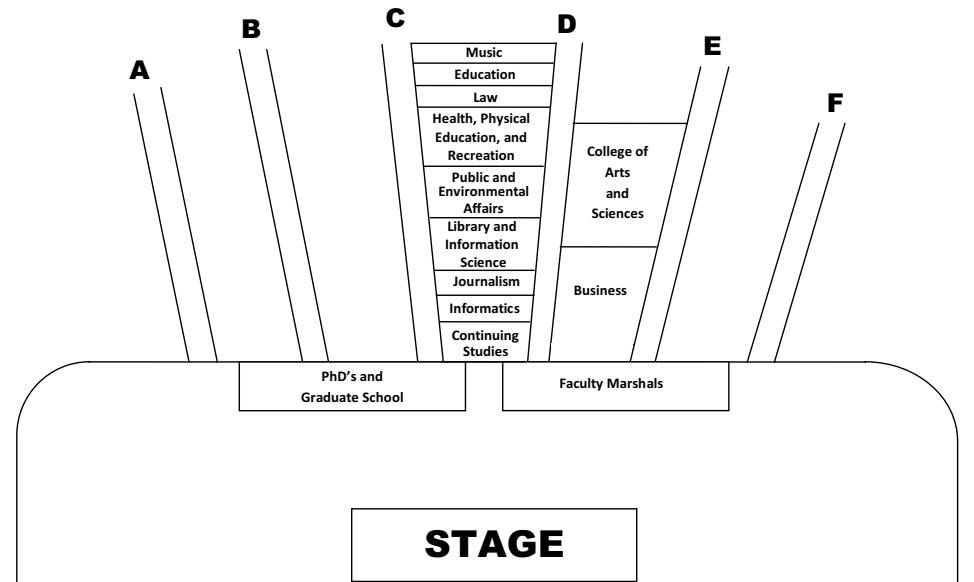
Pay telephones are located in the North and South Lobbies, and on the Concourse Level and Balcony Level.

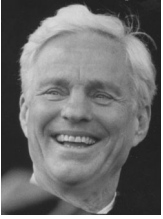

# INDIANA UNIVERSITY COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

## **Richard C. Atkinson** President Emeritus, University of California



Richard C. Atkinson, president emeritus of the University of California, has had a long and distinguished career as an educator, administrator, and scientist.

Atkinson, the seventeenth president of the University of California, assumed the

presidency in 1995 and served until 2003. As leader of California's public university system, Atkinson took innovative approaches to admissions and outreach and also established research initiatives to increase the university's contributions to the state's economy. In addition, he worked to institute significant changes to the SAT I, the most widely used college entrance exam, leading to a major shift in the way millions of high school students are tested for college admissions.

Before becoming president of the University of California, Atkinson served as chancellor of the San Diego campus of the University of California from 1980 to 1995. As chancellor at UCSD, Atkinson helped transform the campus into one of the nation's leading research universities. Under his leadership, enrollment doubled to nearly 18,000, and the quality and scope of its programs increased. In 1995 the National Research Council ranked the quality of UCSD's graduate programs tenth in the nation.

Prior to his tenure at the University of California, Atkinson served as director of the National Science Foundation (NSF). He was appointed deputy director of the NSF by President Gerald Ford in 1975, then promoted to director in 1977 by President Jimmy Carter. In his role as director, Atkinson was responsible for overseeing the nation's science policy. One of his most important accomplishments was negotiating the first agreement for the exchange of scientists and scholars between the United States and the People's Republic of China.

Atkinson began his academic career at Stanford University, where he was a faculty member from 1956 to 1980, except for a three-year period

during which he was at the University of California, Los Angeles. At Stanford he served as a professor of psychology, and he also held appointments in the School of Engineering, the School of Education, the Applied Mathematics and Statistics Laboratories, and the Institute for Mathematical Studies in the Social Sciences.

Atkinson's research in the field of cognitive science and psychology has focused on problems of memory and cognition. His theory of human memory has influenced subsequent research in the field, particularly in the areas of the relationship between cerebral structures and psychological phenomena and the effects of drugs on memory. His work also has been used to help develop techniques that optimize the learning process. He has written or edited nearly 25 books and more than 170 articles.

He has also applied his research to classroom learning. His system for computer-assisted instruction, one of the first of its kind, served as a prototype for the commercial development of computer-assisted instruction. He was co-founder of the Computer Curriculum Corporation.

Atkinson received a Bachelor of Philosophy degree from the University of Chicago and a Ph.D. from Indiana University. He has been awarded honorary doctoral degrees from a number of universities, including Indiana University.

Atkinson has held numerous leadership positions over the course of his career. He is the past president of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the former chair of the Association of American Universities. He is also a member of the National Academy of Sciences, the National Academy of Arts and Sciences, the Institute of Medicine, the Society of Experimental Psychologists, the National Academy of Education, and the American Philosophical Society. His contributions to science and higher education have also led to a slightly unusual tribute: there is a mountain in Antarctica named in his honor. Mount Atkinson is located at 78° 39' S.L. 85° 30' W.L.

# INDIANA UNIVERSITY HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

## John R. Seffrin Doctor of Science



John R. Seffrin, the visionary leader of the American Cancer Society, has touched the lives of millions of Americans and people around the world in his campaign to prevent and control cancer.

His work has personified the society's mission as "the nationwide community-based voluntary health organization dedicated to eliminating cancer as a major health problem by preventing cancer, saving lives, and diminishing suffering from cancer, through research, education, advocacy, and service."

Seffrin's transformational role as chief executive officer of the American Cancer Society (ACS) since 1995 is described jointly by two IU faculty administrators: Dean of the School of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation (HPER) Robert M. Goodman and Chancellor's Professor Mohammad Torabi, who is chair of HPER's Department of Applied Health Science. They write that John Seffrin "has revolutionized the society and integrated the notion of prevention and health education as parts of the overall mission of the society. . . . Dr. Seffrin led a major reorganization and refocusing of the society's priorities resulting in the greatest growth and impact on its lifesaving mission in the society's 92-year history. Having set measurable goals in 1999, the nation's cancer program is now on track to achieve a 50 percent reduction in cancer mortality by the year 2015."

Prior to becoming executive vice president and chief staff officer of the ACS in 1992, Dr. Seffrin was chairperson of the Department of Applied Health Science in IU's School of HPER from 1979 to 1992. Under his leadership, the department became one of the nation's top programs, a distinction that continues today. During his years at IU he was also director of the Center for Health and Safety Studies, chair of the Hazard Control Program Advisory Board, and co-

director of the Institute for Drug Abuse Prevention.

Before joining the IU faculty, Seffrin was a faculty member in health education at Purdue University from 1970 to 1979, serving as chair of Health and Safety Education from 1977 to 1979.

Dr. Seffrin holds the Bachelor of Science degree from Ball State University, the Master of Science in Health Education from the University of Illinois, and the Ph.D. in Health Education from Purdue University. He has been awarded honorary doctoral degrees by both Ball State and Purdue Universities.

Seffrin has served in many leadership positions, including as a member of the Surgeon General's Advisory Committee on Smoking and Health; treasurer of the Partnership for Prevention; co-chair of the National Cancer Legislation Advisory Committee; chair of the National Health Council Board of Directors; and treasurer of the National Dialogue on Cancer, chaired by President George H. W. Bush. He has also served as president of the International Union against Cancer, based in Geneva, Switzerland, which coordinates efforts across the globe to contain cancer. He was the recipient of the Presidential Citation from the Society for Public Health Education in Washington, D.C., in 2007. He has served on the boards of directors of 40 organizations.

Hailed as a dynamic teacher, a brilliant speaker, and a prolific researcher, Seffrin has inspired many young professionals in the field of health education and other areas related to cancer control and prevention. He is the author of six books, seven book chapters, and seventy-five articles, as well as scores of other publications.

"Dr. Seffrin is a visionary," writes David M. Kocuja, associate dean for research in IU's School of HPER. "He was truly a pioneer in the health and wellness field long before the statistics emerged indicating that any of the preventable diseases confronting America will burden the health and well-being of our nation. He has fought a noble fight against preventable disease, has been consistent in his message, and our nation and indeed the world are beginning to

realize the benefits of his message—as a society we are truly winning the war on preventable disease.”

Describing the scope of Seffrin’s work, Lloyd J. Kolbe, associate dean for global and community health in IU’s School of HPER, notes that the ACS leader, in his efforts to control cancer, “has won victories in Congress and state legislatures, in board rooms and convention halls, in the hearts and minds of all who will listen to his most eloquent plea to deny more victims to that disease most feared.”

Kolbe adds that among the work of many who have led the fight against cancer, “one will be remembered throughout the history of humankind for his vision, diplomatic and political acumen, his organizational wisdom, his compassion, and his never-ending commitment to mitigate the terror and suffering visited upon his fellow human beings by the vicissitudes of cancer. That leader is John Seffrin.”
