The conflict also involved a malicious anonymous letter to Professor Hall forged to look like it was from President Wylie. Professor Hall and Harney both resigned within the next year due to more conflicts with President Wylie. Cases often involved punishing a student for missing chapel, however, this case was unique because of who was involved and the incident it concerned.
