Constitution of 1Life

Preamble

Description

1Life Ministry meets every Monday, from 6:30-8pm, on campus at a dorm, library, or common area. We have a small group discussion. We organize outreaches on IUB campus and in the Bloomington community. Additionally, we host events to further our goal of encouraging students to connect with God and connect with each other.

Purpose & Aim

1Life Ministry is a Christian Organization in Bloomington, Indiana. We seek to create a community where young adults can build relationships with each other and connect with God.

Article I: Membership

Statement of Anti-Discrimination:

1Life allows any interested student to participate in, become a member of, and seek leadership positions in the organization without regard to arbitrary consideration of such characteristics as age, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, marital status, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status.

1Life is open to anyone who feels led to be apart of this ministry. There are no existing dues to be a member of 1Life. Membership can be revoked if an individual acts outside of our code of conduct. The individual will be recommended for removal, a meeting among leaders will vote, and the majority vote will determine the decision for their removal. Our first class of membership would be a regular attendee who is present at least twice a month. Our second class of membership would be a volunteer. Our third class of membership would be executive officers.

Article II: Statement of Compliance

This organization shall comply with all Indiana University regulations, and local, state, and federal laws.

Article III: Executive Officers

1Life will have two executive officers. The 1st will be the president. The role of the president will be to oversee the teams and will also annually reregister the organization. The 2nd will be the vice president. The role of the vice president is to assist the president in overseeing the teams and to fill in for the president in his or

her absence. There will also be team leaders that will service on various teams listed below.

Teams

Information Team – The Info team’s role is to communicate important information to 1Life members. Responsibilities include the weekly email, managing social media (Facebook, Instagram and twitter) and processing 1 time guest information.

Food Team – The Food team’s role is to provide food at 1Life Monday night services and any special events that include food. Responsibilities includes determining menus, grocery shopping, food preparation, and clean-up after meals.

Rides Team - The Rides team’s role is to provide rides to 1Life members from IU campus to City Church. Responsibilities include providing rides to Monday night services, Sunday 11:30 service, and any other special events 1Life may have.

Setup/Tear Down Team – The Setup/Tear Down team’s role is to prepare the church for the 1Life service on Monday nights. Responsibilities include setting up tables and chairs for dinner in the foyer and setting up extra chairs in the lounge, and striking all tables and chairs after the service is over.

Media Team – The Media team’s role is to manage the technology and lighting for 1Life events. Responsibilities include running lights, sound, videos, and song lyrics from the tech booth in the lounge, and helping with tech for larger events in the sanctuary.

Outreach Team – The Outreach team’s role is to coordinate outreach events in the community throughout the year and advertise for 1Life events throughout the community. Responsibilities include hanging up posters, handing out fliers, and coordinating outreach efforts like the summer groups outreach.

Greeting Team - The Greeting Team’s Role is to provide greeters for 1Life services. Responsibilities include welcoming members and first time guests, getting first time guests connected with members, and taking down email and contact information.

Small Group Facilitator Team - Small group facilitators lead group discussions with questions provided from the speaker.

Article IV: Advisor

1Life will have two advisors. One of the advisors will be a faculty member at Indiana University. The other advisor will be a representative from City Church for All Nations. Both of the advisors will be a source of encouragement and guidance for the organization. The only qualifications are that the advisors have the time to commit to assisting the ministry as needed.

Article VI: Meetings

1Life Ministry meets every Monday night, from 6:30-9pm, off campus at City Church for All Nations. We have a shuttle service to pick up students from various residence halls every week. We serve food weekly, engage in song, hear a message, and break out into small group discussion. We send weekly reminder emails to inform members about meetings. We have social media accounts where we post reminders about our meetings and upcoming events.

Article VII: Elections

Elections will be held once a year. A maximum of 3 people who are able to be nominated to run for office. Voting will be administered through a secret ballot with a minimum of 75% of members present. Members will be notified at least 3 months in advance of an upcoming election.

Article VIII: Anti-Hazing

Hazing is strictly prohibited. Hazing shall be defined as any conduct which subjects another person, whether physically, mentally, emotionally, or psychologically, to anything that may endanger, abuse, degrade, or intimidate the person as a condition of association with a group or organization, regardless of the person's consent or lack of consent.

Article VIII: Dues & Budgets

There are no dues required for membership. The treasurer maintains the group's budget.

Article IX: Finances

Our treasurer will be in charge of financial affairs. We will be applying and maintaining a Student Organization Account. We will follow the SOA accounts office policies and procedures. If group dissolves, the remaining money will go towards City Church for All Nations as donation.

Article X: Personal Gain Clause

This organization, if raising funds, shall ethically raise and distribute profits from organizational functions to either the organization or to members who provide a service that directly benefits the organization. Individual members may not receive compensation from for-profit companies if acting as a representative of a student organization

Article XI: Amendments

Eligible voting members will be notified of proposed amendments by email. In order to ratify an amendment, 2/3 of present members are required.
