#### IU Libraries Apparel on Sale Now for Gift-Giving Season

From now through December 6 a pop-up online store is ready for anyone to self-purchase select apparel items with the one of three logos embroidered (IU Libraries, Lilly Library or IU Press).

How does it work?

1. Visit: <https://iulibraries.wbgcompanystore.com/category/62762/home.html>
2. Click "apparel" or "accessories" to browse the available items.
3. Several colors are usually available for each item, so be sure to click through to see the options. Once you choose an item, you select the logo you want embroidered from a drop-down menu.
4. Pay with your personal credit card and enter your personal address so the items can be shipped to you.

This opportunity is a response to requests we have had to purchase items with the Library "logo." It is not a fundraiser for the library – and it is operated completely by the vendor. Any service issues or other concerns (shipping, etc.) will need to be resolved with this online store.

### IU LIBRARIES BLOGS

December. Based off our testing, we will decide by December 6 whether to proceed with the upgrade. If so, we will upgrade the system during the normal maintenance window on the morning of December 22 (with an alternate date of January 5, 2020).

During the upgrade, the old Symphony Workflows client cannot be used for work. Once the upgrade is complete, the new SD Workflows client can be installed and used. (We will work with computer workstation administrators who can help deploy and install the new client.)

Additionally, My Account and item requesting in IUCAT will be unavailable during the upgrade. More information about IUCAT during the upgrade will be communicated out to our patrons via a banner message on IUCAT.

We will be in touch again with you on December 6 after our decision about going forward with the upgrade has been made. For now, key dates to keep in mind regarding the upgrade are as follows:

- December 6 - Go/no go decision deadline for upgrade.
- December 21 - Plan to have any needed work and materials processing (particularly circulation) in the old SD Workflows client finished by 6pm.
- December 22 - During the production upgrade window (which lasts until 10am), the Workflows client cannot be used. Any essential circulation activities that occur at this time must be kept manually for later input. Also, My Account and requesting services in IUCAT will be unavailable.

Thanks for your and your staff's support during this process.

Using inclusive vocabularies, defined here as those vocabularies representative of and created by historically marginalized communities, is helpful for providing options when creating original description. Is it possible to also supply these vocabularies for use as a navigation aid into a system that only makes use of commonly used controlled vocabularies that are not as inclusive or representative, such as Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH)? This talk will explore progress in learning about the scope of available controlled vocabularies and classification schemes from marginalized communities and a proof-of-concept project to engage such a vocabulary as an information retrieval aid for search and discovery against a system using only LCSH for subjects (a typical library catalog).
