FRED R. HARRIS

Former U.S. Senator Fred R. Harris is a widely-published author and has been a distinguished member of the political science faculty at the University of New Mexico since 1976.

Designated an " Eminent Scholar " by the New Mexico Commission on Higher Education, Harris has produced fourteen books, including Deadlock or Decision: The U.S. Senate and the Rise of National Politics, published in 1993 by Oxford University Press.

A Phi Beta Kappa graduate in political science of the University of Oklahoma, Harris holds a J.D. degree " with Distinction " from the same institution. He has been a Fulbright Scholar for research and study in Mexico (1981) and a Distinguished Fulbright Lecturer in Uruguay (1989). He was a Visiting Professor at Mexico's National University in 1982, and, in 1986, taught in a London Semester Program and lectured at Oxford University. He was Director of the University of New Mexico's Overseas Summer School Program, Guadalajara, Mexico, 1990, and Granada, Spain, 1992.

Harris was a member of the U.S. Senate from Oklahoma (D., 1964-1973), a member of the President's National Advisory Commission on Civil Disorders, the Kerner Commission (1967-1968), Chair of the Democratic National Committee ( 1969-1970 ), Co-Chair ( with John V. Lindsay ) of the National Urban Coalition's Commission on the Cities in the 1970's and candidate in 1976 for his party's presidential nomination. In 1988, he co-chaired ( with Roger W. Wilkins ) the Commission on the Cities and is co-editor with Wilkins of Quiet Riots: Race and Poverty in the United States, published by Pantheon Press.
