Titan Athletics  
Season End Report  
2006-07**

The purpose of this report is to review the 2006-07 Titan athletics program. Overall, the report will focus on five areas: student-athletes grade point average (GPA), win/loss records, season honors and awards, season attendance and Titan community service highlights.

Titan athletics participates in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) at the division one level. The NAIA is divided into 14 regions; Titan athletics is located in region seven and participates in the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference (CCAC). The CCAC is comprised of fifteen members; divided into NAIA divisions one and two, sanctioning five men's sports and six women's sports.

**Student-Athlete GPA**

The NAIA requires student-athletes to maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0. The IU-South Bend athletics committee requires student-athletes to maintain a 2.0 GPA every semester. This report focused on the 2006-07 fall and spring semester average GPAs of each team and overall GPA for the entire program. See Chart B. In the fall semester the women's basketball program had five student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or higher. In the spring semester three student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or higher and one made the IU South Bend Dean's List. The men's basketball program had two student-athletes who earned a 3.0 GPA or higher in the fall and spring semesters. Overall, seven student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or higher in the fall semester. In the spring semester five student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or higher, and one student-athletes earned a 3.5 GPA or higher.

### **Win/Loss Records**

The Lady Titans finished 8-22 overall, 4-8 in CCAC competition, finishing fifth in conference play. The Lady Titans completed their season losing to Robert Morris College in the CCAC quarterfinal round. See chart C.

**Attendance**

The overall season attendance experienced a .03% decrease from the 2005-06 season. The 2006-07 season attendance total was 3,150 as compared to 3,160 a year ago. The Lady Titans had a total of 1,251, a 6.3% decrease from last year. Last year's attendance was 1,336. Their single game season high was 140 vs. St. Francis (IL) February 3, 2007. The Titans home attendance was 1,899 which was a 4.1% increase from the previous season. Last year's attendance was 1,824. The Titans single game high was 312 vs. Bethel December 20, 2006. **Titan 2006-07 Community Service Highlights**

- In August the women's basketball team participated in the Walk to Cure Diabetes sponsored by the Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund International.
- In December the Titan athletic department participated in the St. Vincent's DePaul Society's Holiday program. Titan athletics donated several gifts to a local family. The department also donated over 200 canned food goods to the South Bend Center for the Homeless.
- In February at Homecoming 2007, Titan athletics hosted Lincoln Primary Day at both a men's and women's game. Titan athletics invited Lincoln Primary's top third and fourth graders to participate in an event combining education and athletics. Each student chose their favorite Titan player and kept track of their points for the first half. All the students were acknowledged at halftime. Also on that day Titan Athletics held a book drive for Lincoln Primary; 89 books were donated.
- In March Titan athletics teamed up with the Civil Rights Heritage Center and hosted a Sports activities and education day for Dickinson Intermediate. We divided the students up into five groups of four. They participated in four physical activities and one mental activity that included using sports as math word problems.
