 - A. Reminder that anyone can request a ballot vote on voting items.
 - B. IU East representatives for UFC (University Faculty Council) are Cathy Ludlum Foos and Laverne Nishihara. Just a reminder that the UFC Constitution's amendments were approved last May. The next meetings will be held on October 30 and on February 26 at the IUPUI campus. UFC will also be attending President McRobbie's address at IUPUI on Tuesday, October 9, at 1:00 p.m. Later in the upcoming year, President McRobbie plans on addressing the mandatory retirement age of 65 for upper level administrators. At IU East last year, all but one faculty member responding to an inquiry opposed the current policy.
 - C. Student Services Initiative will be moving to online practices with the intention of making it more efficient and cut costs. More announcements will be made at a later date about the initiative.
 - D. Summer Tuition discounts will be offered again for Summer 2013. After that IU will determine if the discounts are increasing summer enrollment and if the offer should continue.

- F. AAA will bring forward Transfer Admission Standards in an effort to make the standards more uniform across regional campuses.
