- Agenda -

Discuss committee charges for 2019-20 AY and create plan:

1. Policy change to IUE admissions requirements for ACT or SAT tests, shifting campus to “test optional admissions, but considered holistically [which] was mentioned in the Regional Faculty Caucus in Summer 2019”. (priority issue from UFC) *\*new\**
2. Changing dates for readmission appeals. *\*new\**
3. Complete revision of “Application for Reinstatement” and submit for Faculty Senate vote.
4. Discussion changing grade due dates to allow additional time. (from UFC) *\*new\**
5. Review past readmissions success rates and continue to develop and implement permanent plan to track students following readmission. (This item had an expected completion during AY 18-19; however, staff departure put this on hold until replacement was hired.)
6. Work with offices of registrar, financial aid, and advising to identify policy issues.
7. Continue to address student appeals and develop a voting process that is consistent with data-based decision making and research on student success.
8. Update other AAA related policies and materials as needed.

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### Admission Requirements

Our students are from diverse backgrounds yet share common goals to further their education. Determining admission to IU East requires consideration for the following criteria and standards.

- High School Curriculum:** Recent high school graduates from Indiana are expected to earn an Indiana Core 40, Core 40 with Academic Honors or Core 40 with Technical Honors Diploma.
- Out-of-state students** are expected to complete a minimum of 28 semesters of college prep courses that include:
  - 4 years of English
  - 3 years of Social Science (History, Government, Economics, Psychology, or Sociology)
  - 3 years of Math (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II)
  - 3 years of Lab Science (Biology, Chemistry, or Physics)
  - 4 years of additional college prep courses which include additional Math, Lab Science, Social Science, Computer Science, Foreign Language, or other college-prep courses
- Recent high school graduates should rank in the upper half of their graduating class.**
- Students applying directly from high school are required to take the SAT or ACT.** SAT or ACT scores may also be required for admission to a specific program. IU East school codes for reporting SAT and ACT scores to IU East are:
  - SAT - 1194
  - ACT - 1216
  - SAT or ACT scores should meet or exceed the Indiana median scores
- Graduation from a commissioned Indiana high school or comparable out-of-state institution.** We review applications from students with above average scores on the General Educational Development Test (GED).

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Other campuses:

IU BL, IUPUI, IUFW, IUK, IUN, IUSB, IUSE - SAT or ACT - required

IUPUC – SAT or ACT (priority consideration)

Possible policy language (from Senate President, Nishihara):

Indiana University East should be allowed to adopt “test optional” undergraduate admissions, for which applicants for admission would not be required to submit standardized college admissions test scores (e.g., SAT or ACT scores).
