Liberal Arts Core^b	<p>At least six courses fulfilling the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two natural science courses, at least one with a lab (“scientific ways”). (7-8 cr) • Two social science courses (“social & behavioral ways”). (6 cr) • Two humanities/arts courses (“humanistic and artistic ways”). (6 cr) <p>Minimum of 19 credits</p> <div data-bbox="1549 435 1940 867" style="border: 1px solid black; background-color: #fff9c4; padding: 5px;"> <p>Pathway Option Students may take a minimum of three courses from two different ways of knowing around an approved common theme. Themes will be constituted generally by 8-12 courses with some number from each way of knowing.</p> </div>
Diversity and Ethically Responsible Citizenship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One course designated Diversity.^c • One course designated Ethically Responsible Citizenship.^c <p>These requirements can be met with either two of the six Liberal Arts Core courses above or two courses in the student’s major or a combination of both.</p>
Total hours	<p>Minimum of 30 credits</p>

^a From an approved list. May include courses in statistics at the 300-/400-level in the discipline. A new 3-cr MATH-M course will be developed to replace MATH-M 133/134 (2+2 cr.) for those majors who do not have a discipline-specific statistics course.

^b All\ courses in the Liberal Arts Core must fulfill the learning outcomes for “Scientific Ways of Knowing,” “Social and Behavioral Ways of Knowing,” or “Humanistic and Artistic Ways of Knowing.” Each course must have a separate disciplinary/area of study prefix (except for lab courses which in some cases are separated into lecture and lab courses with different numbers). Courses at the 300-/400-level can be approved, if they have no more than one pre-requisite course.

^c From an approved list of courses. May include courses from the Liberal Arts Core or courses from the major.
