About The Artists

Elkhart native VICTORIA ATWATER holds both Master and Bachelor degrees in Voice Performance from the Indiana University School of Music in Bloomington where she performed in many leading operatic roles, including American premieres of *Legend of the Tsar Saltan* by Rimsky-Korsakov and *Tamerlano* by Handel. She has toured the Middle East and Europe in addition to performing with several opera companies in Florida. Most recently she played the role of Adele in *Die Fledermaus* with the Treasure Coast Opera, a return engagement following her highly acclaimed role as Musetta in *La Boheme* last season. This season's concert performances include *Mozart's Mass in C Minor* as well as with the Gilbert and Sullivan Society in Palm Beach. Future engagements include the role of Gilda in *Rigoletto* and two operatic concerts as featured soprano soloist with Opera at Florham in New Jersey.

CELIA STINEBAUGH WEISS holds a B.M.E. from Manchester College and a M.M. in Piano from Indiana University. She is founding director of the IUSB Arts Academy and head of the piano accompanying program of the Division of the Arts. In 1989 she received the Adjunct Merit Status Award for her excellence in teaching and service to IUSB. A pianist and organist wellknown to area audiences, she appeared this season with the Manchester Symphony as piano soloist and as organ soloist with the Elkhart County Symphony. Next season she will perform with both the Elkhart Municipal Band and the Elkhart County Symphony. Mrs. Weiss is Music Director and Organist at First Presbyterian Church, Elkhart.
