## Chancellor's Medallion goes to Jerrol Z. Miles

**N**ew Albany community leader and banker **Jerrol Z. Miles**, BS'70, was one of two highly respected public figures to receive the Indiana University Southeast Chancellor's Medallion for 2005. The other recipient was Judy O'Bannon, wife of Indiana former-Gov. Frank O'Bannon.

The two were honored during the 12th annual Chancellor's Medallion dinner at Huber Plantation Hall in Starlight, Ind., on Feb. 26. Proceeds from the dinner went toward scholarships for IU Southeast students. Local news anchor Barry Bernson, of WDRB Fox-41, was the master of ceremonies.

Throughout the years, Jerrol Z. Miles has devoted countless hours of service and maintained deep connections to Indiana University.

Immediately following graduation, Miles joined Kentucky's largest bank, National City Bank (then known as First National Bank of Louisville), where he spent 33 years until retiring as senior vice president and manager of the special credits department in 2003. Miles handled commercial lending to a range of companies, including some on the Fortune 500 list of top corporations.

Miles has been active in civic affairs, having served on the boards of directors for both nonprofit and for-profit organizations, notably the Southern Indiana 2020 Steering Committee; Floyd Memorial Hospital Foundation; Indiana School Board Association (two-year state convention delegate); New Albany-Floyd County School Corp. (president, 1973); former-Gov. Robert Orr's Task Force on Mental Health and Personnel Advisory Committee; Indiana State Department of Public Instruction; Metro United Way (chair of several committees); and Better Business Bureau (chair, 2000-01).

For more than 11 years, Miles has served as a member of IU Southeast's board of advisers (president, 1997-99). In 2002, he established the Jerrol Z. Miles Scholarship at IU Southeast. His service to the university also includes

participation on the search committee for an athletics director; board of directors of IU Louisville/Southern Indiana Alumni Club; Neal-Marshall Alumni Club's board of managers; charter member of the board of directors for the Kentuckiana Chapter of the Neal-Marshall Alumni Club; IU Athletics Committee (chair, Budget and Finance Subcommittee); and Search and Screen Committee for Chancellor of IU Southeast (1995-96 and 2001-02).

Miles's numerous awards include the Allen Society Leadership Award, presented by Metro

United Way; Outstanding Kentucky Volunteer and President's Award, from United Way of Kentucky; Black Achiever Award, from the Louisville Downtown YMCA; Sagamore of the Wabash, from former-Gov. Robert Orr; and the Order of Kentucky Colonels, from Kentucky former-Gov. Wallace Wilkinson.

Miles and his wife, Alice, a registered nurse, have two daughters, Stacey Mecier and Melissa Hearn, and a son, Chris Miles. They have four grandchildren and are guardians to two nephews.

The merit-based Neal-Marshall Alumni Club Scholarships are awarded to undergraduates who are enrolled at any Indiana University campus or who will be enrolled during the next academic semester. To date, approximately 22 scholarships, totaling more than \$10,695, have been awarded to aspiring students.

To be eligible, applicants must possess a minimum 2.5 grade point average as a high

school or college student. Applicants must be currently enrolled or have been accepted to Indiana University for the next academic semester. Applicants must/will be full-time students (12 credit hours). Along with an official letter of application, applicants must submit three letters of recommendations and an official college or high school transcript.





## News from the Tavis Smiley camp

According to an Associated Press news release, **Tavis Smiley**, BSPA'03, has found a new public radio home and will soon begin hosting a weekend discussion show.

On March 10, Smiley, who left National Public Radio in December after a contract dispute, announced a deal with Public Radio International to host *The Tavis Smiley Show* and produce other programs. He will continue to serve as host of his late-night PBS talk show, *Tavis Smiley*, and is creating a series of prime-time specials for PBS. The first, “American Ascension,” is set to air this summer.

Smiley says he missed the daily intellectual stimulation of radio. “I received as much as I gave,” he told Associated Press. “Just moderating these conversations every day, asking questions every day, I learned as much as the audience did.”

Smiley “deserves to be heard on public radio,” says Eleanor Harris, PRI marketing and distribution chief. Smiley's show reflects PRI's effort to broaden “the range and reach of public radio.”

The show, debuting on April 29 as two hours of programming intended to air in the Friday-to-Sunday window, will feature newsmakers and regular commentators, including

Professor Cornel West, of Princeton University, and former Congressman J.C. Watts.

In 2002, Smiley became the host of NPR's first black-oriented show. He left when his contract ended, alleging NPR didn't make his show's renewal a priority and failed to live up to promises to expand marketing efforts.

NPR maintained it was eager to keep Smiley on the air, but financially unable to meet his demand for what it characterized as a hefty marketing budget. Ed Gordon, like Smiley an alumnus of Black Entertainment Television, was hired by NPR as host of the daily *News & Notes with Ed Gordon*.

Radio stations can be affiliated with both the PRI and NPR networks, and Smiley says he “fully expects to be on the same number of stations, if not more,” than the roughly 90 affiliates he reached with NPR. His schedule, including TV and book obligations and his nonprofit foundation, makes resumption of a daily radio show difficult now, he said.

Smiley wants to bring other minorities on board with programming produced by his company and distributed by PRI under the new deal. “I figure I'm not the only person of color who can do this successfully,” he says of creating public radio shows.
