The academic year is off to a great start and we have a lot of exciting news to share about the program. The HESA Master's program has implemented a new mission and learning outcomes that is grounded in the essential learning outcomes that were outlined in the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AACU), College Learning for the New Global Century (2007). A committee of faculty, students, and graduate assistantship providers worked throughout the 2007-2008 academic year to review the master's curriculum and the recommendations are scheduled to be implemented in Fall 2009. We are excited about the new program of studies and look forward to sharing more with you as the year progresses.

In addition, the higher education and student affairs program is expanding

the academic offerings we provide to undergraduate students at Indiana University. LEAD IU is an initiative in which we have partnered with the Student Activities Office, Indiana Memorial Union, and Residential Programs and Services to offer both in class and out of class activities that promote engagement on campus. The academic component of this program consists of courses (EDUC U495 topical seminars) that are instructed by both faculty and student affairs professionals on campus.

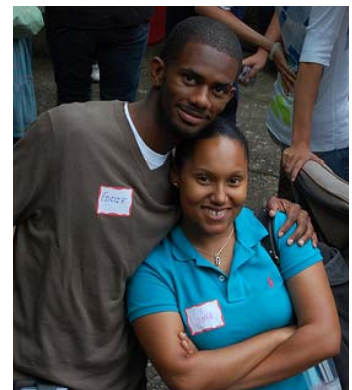
We have also launched a more comprehensive instructional program surrounding our EDUC U212 courses. These courses provide the opportunity for HESA doctoral students to teach an undergraduate topical seminar that is aligned with their research interests. This year we have partnered with Dr. Joan Middendorf from Instructional Support Services to provide our students with a series of seminars designed to allow students the opportunity get some personnel assistance associated with the creation and evaluation of course

instruction.
