

interpret the rooms and answer questions. There will be ample time to also explore the four-block National Historic Site surrounding the home. Many other historic structures have been preserved; a self-guiding walking tour of the neighborhood has signs at each house describing the home's residents in 1860. The area includes a wealth of memorabilia reflecting the life of Lincoln in the mid-1850s when he was a resident of Springfield. (Lincoln died on April 15, 1865.)

An informal reception at the hotel following the afternoon tour will provide an opportunity for groups with similar preferences to make dinner arrangements. The evening is free to enjoy shopping and any of the excellent and varied restaurants in downtown Springfield.

Sunday breakfast is on your own.

After a brief welcome presentation, explore the just-opened Lincoln Presidential Museum. This collection of amazingly well-preserved artifacts tells the entire life story of our nation's 16th president. The museum, unlike any other in the U.S., features hi-tech exhibits, interactive displays, and multimedia programs. Close by the museum are the Lincoln Library opened in 2004, the Lincoln-Herndon Law Offices, and the Old State Capitol where Lincoln made major speeches and where he lay in state following his assassination.



Lunch is on your own in the Museum's café or a nearby restaurant.

Visit the inside of the monumental Lincoln Tomb that contains the crypts of President and Mrs. Lincoln and three of their four children. The text of major speeches are included on tablets and statues depict stages of Lincoln's career.



Frank Lloyd Wright's Dana-Thomas House is the final stop. Following an orientation presentation, docents will take the group on a detailed tour of the entire house. This early example of Wright's prairie style architecture was built in 1902-04. It is one of the most elaborate in terms of size, detailing, art glass, and furnishings. There are more than 100 pieces of original Wright designed furniture and 450 art glass doors, windows, panels and lamps.

Enjoy snacks and beverages as the miles fly by on the bus ride home.


INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP



Topic: "The New College Student" - Dr. McKaig will speak about how today's college student compares with students of the past and will discuss in detail some of the issues facing today's students and the Division of Student Affairs.

Dr. Richard (Dick) McKaig, who came to IU in 1971, has served as Vice Chancellor, Dean and Associate Professor of Education since 1991. The Office of the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and Dean of Students at IU oversees the Division of Student Affairs. It provides broad support to individual students, student groups, parents, alumni and other members of the Bloomington campus. Its involvement in campus life cuts across a wide range of issues, activities and services, even as it coordinates policy, budget and personnel matters for the student services area. Dr. McKaig was awarded the 2005 Scott Goodnight Award for Outstanding Performance as a Dean by the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators in the spring. The award is given to a dean who has demonstrated sustained professional service in student affairs work, high-level competency in administrative skills, innovative response in meeting students' varied and emerging needs, effectiveness in developing junior staff members and leadership in community and university affairs.


