REGISTRATION: See Calendar for days and hours of registration. Full-time students carry from twelve to seventeen hours per semester. Five or six hours only per semester are recommended for students who are employed full time. Deviations from recommended loads must be approved by the Academic Counselor.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING: A program of counseling, coordinated with the program on the Bloomington Campus, is available at the Regional Campus through the Academic Counselor. All new students and others having questions concerning their programs should meet, before they register, with the Academic Counselor. New students are urged to attend the Orientation Session on September 5, 1963. Students who will continue at Indiana University the study of a foreign language begun elsewhere are required to take the Foreign Language Placement Test. For date of this, consult the Calendar.

REFUNDS: Limited refunds may be approved under special circumstances and in accordance with the schedule listed in the **GENERAL BULLETIN OF THE UNIVERSITY EXTENSION DIVISION** and posted on "Official Notice" Bulletin Boards at the South Bend Campus. Refunds are based on the date of the **WRITTEN** application for withdrawal. No refunds will be issued if application for withdrawal is made after the end of the fourth week of classes. No refunds will be made of laboratory fees or for withdrawals from non credit offerings.

VETERANS: Veterans may take training under Public Laws 550, 894, and 634. Application forms and information are available in the office at the Campus. Applicants should notify the office during the registration period if they wish to receive benefits under any of the Public Laws listed above. To obtain full financial benefits, veterans must register for at least fourteen hours (seven hours in the Summer Session).

FEE PAYMENT POLICY

Fees are due in full at the time of registration. They may be deferred by the Director only in unusual cases. Application for such deferral must be addressed in letter form to the Director prior to September 4, 1963.

A fee of \$5 will be charged for make-up examinations in regular courses (except in case of a conflict in the examination schedule) and for all special examinations.
