The Indiana University Bloomington Libraries' Digital Collections Services department has offered Digital Project Planning consultation services twice a week since the opening of the Scholars' Commons in September 2014. Data collected from these consultation sessions provides insight into the individuals engaged in digital scholarship projects and initiatives at Indiana University. Building upon analysis performed by Meridith Beck Sayre, Council on Library and Information Resources Data Curation Postdoctoral Fellow for Data Curation in the Humanities, Dalmou and Homenda will provide an overview of emerging digital project planning and data curation trends and needs demonstrated by Indiana University Bloomington faculty, students and staff as well as recommendations for ongoing support of digital scholarship projects and initiatives on the Bloomington campus and beyond.

ARSC 50th Anniversary Conference at IU

Indiana University will be hosting the Association for Recorded Sound Collections' 50th anniversary conference on May 11-14, 2016 at the IMU Biddle Hotel and Conference Center. The conference will bring together sound recording archivists and record collectors, including many of the world's foremost experts in recorded sound history and technology, for five days of lectures, tours, demonstrations, workshops, exhibits, and special events. Various libraries and archives on campus will be contributing to this effort and some special exhibits will be offered.

The theme of the conference is "Recorded Sound in the 21st Century: Preserving, Collecting, Collaborating & Connecting." A two-day pre-conference "Media Preservation Boot Camp" workshop will be held on May 10-11 in IU's new facility for the Media Digitization and Preservation Initiative. With over 50 sessions, the conference will feature a wide variety of topics ranging from recording artists and labels to technology and restoration, including:

- A celebration of the jazz legacy of Indiana Avenue
- A look at Indiana artists Baby Huey, Cole Porter, and the Hoosier Hot Shots
- Label histories including Gennett, King, Laff, and Advance Recordings
- Early secular and sacred African American recorded music and sermons
- Social and political activism on record
- Treasures from 30 years in the vintage record business
- The Blues Unlimited legacy
- Five decades of folklife on record

Call for Proposals: 5th Annual Indiana University Libraries Information Literacy Colloquium

DATE: Friday, August 5, 2016

PLACE: Indiana University Southeast, New Albany Indiana

THEME: Critical Information Literacy: Empowering Learners for Social Change

Critical pedagogy is an approach to teaching and learning that envisions the educational environment as a site for social change. Practitioners of critical information literacy instruction seek to incorporate an emphasis on social justice into the library setting in a number of ways, including resisting the passive banking method of teaching and learning, disrupting and transforming the power relations between teacher and learner, validating student voice and experiential knowledge, and exposing how oppression and societal inequities shape information production and dissemination.

The planning committee for the IU Libraries Information Literacy Colloquium is seeking proposals for 45-minute interactive breakout session presentations that investigate, examine, or describe how critical pedagogy can be enacted in the library instruction setting. Suggested topics include, but are not limited to:

- Critical pedagogy teaching strategies for information literacy instruction
- Successes and challenges of adopting critical approaches in information literacy instruction
- Critical approaches to revising the information literacy curriculum
- Critical approaches to information literacy at the reference desk
- Classroom or program assessment from critical pedagogy perspectives
- Communicating with faculty and the campus at large about critical pedagogy
- Incorporating critical information literacy into library outreach, programming, collection development, or other library services

Proposals should clearly describe how presenters will use interactive strategies to engage attendees. Please submit proposals to <http://tinyurl.com/IULILC16> by May 9, 2016. Presenters will be notified about the status of their proposal by June 1, 2016.

Erika Dowell Wins 2016 William Evans Jenkins Librarian Award

The Jenkins Award Committee is pleased to announce that Erika Dowell, Associate Director and Head of Lilly Library Public Services, has been awarded the 2016 William Evans Jenkins Award.

The award is presented in recognition of truly outstanding contributions to the Indiana University Libraries or to the library profession. Erika distinguished herself through her outstanding leadership and service to the Libraries, the Lilly Library, and the campus. She is also recognized as a collaborator and innovator, both nationally and locally, for special collections librarianship. Julie Bobay, Executive Associate Dean, IU Libraries, said "Erika's contributions to the Libraries, to the University and to the profession have had broad, deep and lasting impacts."

Erika's vision, energy, and achievements are recognized nationally. E.C. Schroeder, Director of the Beinecke Rare Book and Manuscript Library at Yale said, "Erika's ... contributions and services to RBMS have made a significant impact on the broader profession. The profession would be lucky to have more librarians like Erika."

At the Lilly Library, Erika initiated and directed many highly significant and successful digital projects. Her work to increase access to and awareness of the Lilly Library's holdings has elevated the library's international reputation. One example of the many successful digital projects that she has overseen is "[The War of 1812 in the Collections of the Lilly Library.](#)"

She worked tirelessly in many roles to help revise the Libraries tenure process. Julie Bobay said "...her contribution to the ... makeover of the Librarians promotion and tenure process, which had remained essentially unchanged for over 40 years, was enormous." Her nominator, Naz Pantaloni, praised her dedication and willingness to serve. Dr. Craig Dethloff, Bloomington Faculty Council, commented that "Erika's success in service to the campus and the University shines through in all her accomplishments."
