Kuali Open Library Environment is the first Library Management System designed by and for academic and research libraries. Focused on the management and delivery intellectual information, it's being built by a community of higher education partners working together and supporting each other. In this discussion we'll review the LMS itself as well as a quick demonstration of the base application. Additionally we'll talk about where Kuali OLE is with its current release, where Kuali OLE is with current implementations, where Kuali OLE is going with future releases. ## **Fourth Annual Indiana University Libraries Information Literacy Colloquium**

Friday, August 7, 2015

Audience: Academic Librarians

*What Does It All Mean?: Unpacking the Information Literacy Framework*

The discussions around the development of an Information Literacy Framework have enlivened the library instruction community and challenged us to consider new possibilities for defining, teaching, and assessing information literacy on college and university campuses. With our horizons broadened and our perspectives enlightened, we are beginning to ask "Now What?" of a framework that may exist alongside the Information Literacy Standards, may stand on its own, or may become the theoretical and inspirational driving force for librarians in our role as educators for the foreseeable future. In addition to questioning its viability for being the guiding force that drives information literacy in higher education, librarians are developing and adopting new modes and practices regarding its implementation. The planning committee for this event would like to provide a forum for open discussions and working sessions related to the practical application of the framework. We also welcome critical investigations into the usefulness of the framework within particular institutional contexts. Instead of formal presentations and a keynote speech, the IU Libraries Information Literacy Colloquium will feature workshops designed to engage participants in question-raising, solution-proposing, and idea-generating around one (or more) of the six frames of the Information Literacy Framework and its application to librarians' approaches to instruction, assessment, and leadership in higher education.

Pam Owens, Head of the Serials Acquisitions Unit, is retiring at the end of April, 2015, after more than thirty-five years at IUB Libraries. Pam joined the Libraries Serials Department in 1979 as the claims secretary / keypunch operator in the Regional Campuses unit. Holding more and more responsible positions within the Serials Department (Senior Financial Records Coordinator and Head of Serials Procurement and Receipt for Regional Campuses), she was tapped as the IUB Libraries' first Electronic Resources Acquisitions Specialist in 1999. In 2004, she became Head of the Serials Acquisitions unit, the position which she now holds.

Pam participated on several high-level library task forces during her years in serials: SFX vs. Serials Solutions, Data Warehouse, NOTIS and Sirsi library system implementation groups, and various committees for full implementation of the Serials Solutions 360 suite of services. Currently, she manages the IUB Serials Solutions instance and coordinates bibliographic loads with other campuses. On her watch, the IUB Libraries centralized bindery processing in the Serials Receiving unit and supported the current periodicals processes as branch libraries were closed. She served on both the IUB and IUB Libraries Professional Councils. Known throughout the IU Libraries system for her total commitment to customer service, Pam has supported IU campus libraries and the IUB Libraries collection managers with timely and accurate management of serials subscriptions. Please join me in thanking Pam for her many contributions and wishing her all the best in her well-earned retirement.
