Generally, when we think of a digital collection or repository, we think of digital images, ebooks, audio and video files. But some important digital collections, such as bibliographies, don't have content per se but consist of metadata describing a physical object such as a book, a digital object such as an audio recording or an event such as an opera performance. Not surprisingly, this kind of "contentless" digital object is dependent on metadata to describe it. And while we have standards for bibliographic entries in books and articles, we need more complex metadata for digital bibliographic entries. For the past several months, the Library Technology Software Development group has been working on exactly how to represent these contentless digital objects in our Fedora digital repository using the Hydra based software development environment. Using The Televised Opera and Musical Comedy Database as a sample, we will discuss the work we have done to create a general bibliographic tool for the Fedora Digital Repository.

Become a part of Michiana history—scan your photos and documents at the Scan-a-Thon, Saturday, October 24 from noon to 4 at the Main Public Library in downtown South Bend (Studio 304 Digital Lab).

This event is being hosted by the St. Joseph County Public Library and Indiana University South Bend as part of the Michiana Memory digital archive project, a program funded by two Indiana Memory Digitization grants. The project is a joint collaboration between University Archivist and Associate Librarian, Alison Stankrauff and Joe Sipocz, Manager of Local & Family History Services at the St. Joseph Public Library (and adjunct Q110 instructor at IU South Bend).

Stankrauff and Sipocz invite you to bring in your photographs that document key events in St. Joseph County's history concerning civil rights and African American heritage, so they may scan them for possible inclusion in the Michiana Memory database. Volunteers will scan them, take down names, dates and places to set each photo's context, and return them back to you while you wait!
