Next Program: Auer Concert Hall Wednesday, January 12, 2011

Come hear the "Maidee": This may be the perfect antidote for the winter blahs. On Wednesday, January 12, 2011 at **1:30 pm David Kazimir**, Curator of University Organs and Carillons at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, will give a demonstration of the new Maidee H. and Jackson A. Seward Organ in **Auer Concert Hall**. Mr. Kazimir, an organ builder for many years with C. B. Fisk, Inc., the designers and builders of the new organ, helped with the installation and fine tuning of the instrument in June and July of 2009. This three-manual, seventy stop, world-class instrument with nearly 4,000 pipes is at the heart of Indiana University's collection of fourteen pipe organs on the Bloomington campus. AUER HALL is located on the second floor of The Simon Building on Jordan Avenue (formerly School of Education). An ELEVATOR may be reached through the right entrance as you face the building on Jordan Avenue. Take a few steps to the ground level, turn left for the elevator. Press 2F for the second floor. Turn right upon exiting. Entrance to Auer Hall is on the left at the far end. Another ELEVATOR is at the rear of the building, next to the Speech and Hearing facility. Upon entering take the first right to the elevator. Pressing 2 allows direct access to Auer Hall, near the stage. Due to logistics and lack of appropriate space, there will be no refreshments at the Auer Hall program.

Parking at Auer Hall: PARKING is most available in the Jordan Avenue Parking facility, located directly across the street from the Delta Gamma Sorority House, between the Theatre Building and the Musical Arts Center. The Upper Level is available for both A Permit holders and those without parking permits. The gates are raised by swiping the coded end of the permit or by pressing the button to receive a parking ticket. Those without permits will be charged \$3, half the usual fee. Permit holders will need to swipe the permit to exit the facility. The LOWER TIER, entered past the upper level entrance, is reserved for A Permit holders. You may find a few empty spaces, but frequently the lower tier fills by mid-morning. There is a slim chance that A Permit holders may find a space or two in the Musical Arts Center Parking area or behind Simon Hall. Not likely, however, because these areas fill in the morning hours.
