<p>Make postings of available jobs more obvious and helpful to find. Have a class for setting up a budget, an easy student loan payment plan based on my income. Have a list of people that grads can call for everyday "adult career" questions. I felt like I had no information on how to apply for a job or set up a resume. Make it a requirement not a suggestion.</p>
<p>Offer classes based more specific to certain employment types. Even if it is just for a few hours. Have some speakers come in and talk about what they do.</p>
