WHITE COLLABORATIVE AWARD

The White Collaborative Award was revised in 2004 to fund collaborative research efforts developed by one or more tenured or tenure track IU Bloomington Librarians and one or more tenured or tenure track IU (any campus) faculty members. The research efforts should result in a published book or journal article.

Applications for the \$2500 award are being accepted now through November 1. The applications will be reviewed by the White Collaborative Award Committee. The committee will evaluate the applications based upon the following factors:

Qualifications of the applicants ? their educational and research background

The project?s contribution to the subject area of the research

Research methodology

Timeline

Role of each collaborator in the project

Total budget for the project and how the Collaborative Award funding fits with other funding requested or received

Potential targeted venues for published work

The types of expenditures for which the award may be used include: research-related travel and lodging for applicants and collaborators, funding for research assistants, purchasing and/or renting equipment, and photocopying/scanning research materials. The purchase of general office supplies (pens, paper, staples) is excluded.

MAC FALL MEETING OFFERS MUCH FOR LIBRARY PROFESSIONALS AND STUDENTS

Do you work in a Midwestern library and wonder what archives are all about? Then this Fall's Midwest Archives Conference (MAC) meeting is just for you! Held on the beautiful campus of Indiana University in Bloomington, September 29th to October 1st, for a gathering that promises a well-rounded exploration of archival practice.

The Indiana Memorial Union, one of the largest student unions in the country (see www imu.indiana.edu/index.html) (link no longer works) and a peerless academic meeting center, will play host to meeting. The IMU boasts many amenities, including well-appointed hotel rooms, several eateries, a bookstore, cozy lounge areas and meeting rooms ? even a bowling alley, arcade, and billiards room ? all available to MAC meeting attendees!

A set of program offerings designed to explore archival fundamentals has been created especially for this meeting. Learn about archival appraisal, collecting, preservation, outreach and other activities through a combination of sessions and mini-workshops with an emphasis on practicality. The meeting will also include pre-conference workshops on description of archival materials, caring for artifacts in the archives, and hands-on repair of manuscripts and prints. A Vendors? Fair and Information Fair will round out the helpful offerings.

In case you needed further enticement, the meeting will also include a set of tours and other offerings that will allow attendees a chance to get to know the local professional, historical and cultural landscape. A welcoming reception at IU's fascinating William Hammond Mathers Museum of World Culture, a restaurant tour, New Members? Dinner and

a Friday-night ?Bowl-A-Rama? are just a few of the events to engage the meeting-goer. Tours will include the Archives of Traditional Music, the Kinsey Institute for Research in Sex, Gender, and Reproduction, IU?s high-density storage facility (with its state of the art conservation lab), a leisurely look at the ?Old Crescent? area of campus, and a fun ?ghost walk? through the very meeting locale itself.

Beyond the scheduled tours, attendees can take in lots of other great events, activities and local fare both on campus and in the surrounding area, like the IU School of Music?s presentation of Mozart?s ?Cosi fan tutte,? a performance by the Count Basie Orchestra, live theater offerings, Bloomington farmer?s market, and any number of ethnic restaurants, all of which has earned the city of Bloomington praise by the national press for its small-town feel and big-town offerings.
