Biographies

Katelyn Audette is a first-year transfer student at IU South Bend. She previously attended the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, where she performed with numerous ensembles including the UWEC Wind Symphony, the Red Cedar Symphony Orchestra, and the clarinet quartet Just 4 Clarification. She is pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Music and a minor in Spanish.

Nathaniel Baum is a freshman music education major in the Ernestine M. Raclin School of the Arts whose primary instrument is saxophone. He is an involved member of the IUSB Jazz Ensemble, IU South Bend Wind Ensemble, Saxophone Quartet, IUSB Jazz Combo, and Twin Cities Community Band. Nathaniel started his saxophone and instrumental experience when he was 11 years old.

Marian Stetler-Emery teaches theory, music appreciation and piano at IU South Bend, having earned her Master of Music degree in Composition from IUSB in 1997, studying under Dr. David Barton. Her undergraduate work was in music composition as well, earning a B.F.A. from Pennsylvania State University in State College, Pa. She also studied jazz piano and theory with Jimmie Amadie in Philadelphia. She has had both electronic and chamber works performed at both IUSB and Pennsylvania State University as well, and has been a member of the Penn State Concert Band, the IU South Bend Wind Ensemble and Plato and the Western Tradition: a Post-Modern Improvisational Ensemble. Ms. Emery is currently a member of the Twin Cities Jazz Orchestra on piano, and the IUSB Flute Ensemble. She has served on the boards of the Fischhoff National Chamber Music Association, as well as the IUSB Alumni Board. She has taught music composition, theory and directed the choirs in a local private school, and works with elementary students in piano in her private studio in South Bend. Ms. Emery is a professional jazz pianist and vocalist, performing regularly in the area.

Rebecca Hovan teaches at IU South Bend and Goshen College. She is a member of the National Flute Association and served the NFA as chair of the pedagogy committee for five years. As a member of the pedagogy committee, she participated in the preparation of several of the committee's publications. Rebecca is co-author of several titles in the award-winning *Blocki Flute Method* series and is active composing and arranging music for a variety of instrumental combinations and has several titles in print including selections from her CD, *A Silver Christmas*. As a performer, she appears regularly in recital and with various ensembles in the Northern Indiana area and has appeared on programs at NFA conventions and other professional music conferences and festivals. She has presented numerous pedagogy workshops for the NFA, colleges, universities, professional conferences, and flute festivals throughout the United States. She is currently serving the National Flute Association as Masterclass Performers Competition Coordinator.

Kellie Holycross is a senior at IU South Bend graduating with a degree in nursing this spring. Kellie attended Penn High School and played in their Symphonic II band. She competed in ISSMA Solo & Ensemble contest all four years, attended the Donald A. Dake Summer Music Academy with the South Bend Symphony, and played at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago her senior year. At IU South Bend Kellie has been an active member of the Philosophy Club and the Secular Student Alliance.

Joo Hee Jeong was born in South Korea in 1991. Her piano studies began at the age of six. In 2004 she was admitted to Yewon School; an Arts Middle School, from where she graduated in 2007. Following that she studied in the Seoul Art High School with Prof. Chang Hyeongjun and graduated in 2009. In January 2011 Joo Hee came to Indiana University South Bend to study with Alexander Toradze.

Joo Hee's notable awards include first prize of the 36th Teenager Nationwide Piano Competition in Seoul, Korea in September 2005. In February 2006 she participated in the 26th

Young Musicians Festival, and the Ewon Artist Concert. In 2008 she participated in the Seoul National University International Piano Academy and International Piano Academy in Bedford (England). Most recently Joo Hee participated in the ASIA International Piano Academy & Festival in Korea in 2010.

Amanda Malone is a senior at Indiana University South Bend majoring in Music Education with a minor in French. She graduated from John Glenn High School where she was in the marching, concert, and pep bands and was drum major for the marching band for two years. She competed at the ISSMA Solo & Ensemble competition and qualified to attend the state competition twice. At IU South Bend, in addition to Flute Ensemble, Amanda has been principal flute in the Philharmonic Orchestra and IUSB Woodwind Quintet.

Brittany Shannon is a sophomore at Indiana University South Bend pursuing a degree in nursing. Brittany graduated from Knox High School where she was in the marching, concert, and pep bands. She competed at the ISSMA Solo and Ensemble competition and qualified to attend the State competition twice. In addition to the IUSB Flute Ensemble, she has been a member of the IU South Bend Wind Ensemble.

Aleischa Shepherd is pursuing a major in chemistry with a minor in law. She graduated from Buchanan High School in Michigan. Aleischa participated in the Michigan Solo and Ensemble Festival all four years of high school and was also a member of the Lakeland Conference Fine Arts All-Star Band for two years. Aleischa has performed with the IU South Bend Wind Ensemble and has been a member of the IU South Bend Flute Ensemble since her freshman year.

Ilia Ulianitsky was born in Russia in 1989 and immigrated with his family to Israel in 1993. Ilia was awarded top prizes at the Pnina Zalzman, the "Golden Chanukia," and the Chopin competitions in Israel. Away from his home country, Ilia was awarded first prize at the 3rd Schimmel USASU International Competition, first prize at the World Pianovision Most Wanted Competition, Tucson Symphony Young Artist competition and the ASU Soloists competition, among others. Ilia has performed as soloist with the Israel Symphonietta, the Beer-Sheva Mandolin Orchestra, with whom he toured Serbia and Bulgaria, the Symphony of the Southwest, the West Valley Symphony, the MusicaNova Baroque Ensemble, the ASU Symphony, and the Tucson Symphony Orchestra. Ilia has played such venues as the Jerusalem Theater-Henery Krown Hall, the Jerusalem Music Center, The Tucson Symphony Hall, The Orpheum Theatre in Phoenix, and the Shimmel Hall in Braunschweig Germany as part of the Braunschweig Classix Festival.

Ilia's teachers have included Faina Eizenberg, Asaf Zohar, and Baruch Meir. In 2013 Ilia graduated with a bachelors degree from the Colburn School in Los Angeles where he was studying with John Perry. He is pursuing his master's degree with Alexander Toradze at Indiana University South Bend. In addition Ilia has participated in masterclasses with world renowned artists such as Nikolai Petrov, Alexandre Mnodaynts, Emanuel Krasovsky, John O'connor, Richard Goode and Menahem Pressler. Ilia was the recipient of numerous merit scholarships for his outstanding musicianship from the America-Israel Cultural Foundation.

Jiabao Wang is a freshman at Indiana University South Bend majoring in business. She graduated from Culver Academy. She studied flute privately and competed at ISSMA Solo and Ensemble Festival in high school.

Valerie Warrell is currently a sophomore majoring in biology and minoring in piano performance. She is a student of Ketevan Badridze.

Dimitri Zhgenti started learning music when he was nine years old. At that age he began attending Music School in Tbilisi, Georgia. After one year, he started studying music under the direction of Rusudan Hodjava, Professor of Piano in Tbilisi State Conservatory of Music. At the age of 12 Dimitri moved to America, where he continued to study piano with Associate Professor of Piano Judith Shopflin at Whitworth College in Spokane, Wash. A year later he began participating in the various adjudication programs and the National Guild of Pianists auditions. While in Washington, Zhgenti received honorable mentions from the Music Teachers National Association in Des Moines (2004) and Vancouver (2005). In 2007 Dimitri won First Place in the Washington State Music Teachers Association Competition. After moving from Spokane to Vancouver, Wash., Dimitri began studying piano under the direction of Joanna Hodges. As a member of the Joanna Hodges Studio he received a junior achievement award in 2005 and additional achievement awards in 2007 and 2008. He successfully completed four national 10-piece and one international 15-piece programs. Dimitri Zhgenti joined the Toradze Piano Studio in fall 2008.
