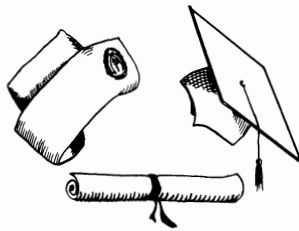

To be tactful—always doing the right thing at the right time.

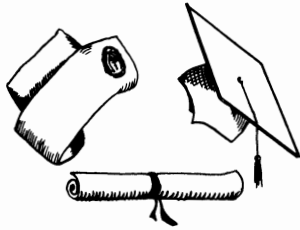
To be courteous—for this is the badge of good breeding.
