5. Recital: Young Sook Kim, award-winning student pianist at IUSB, will give a recital at 8:15 p.m. Friday in N158. The program will include Brahms' "Variations and Fugue on a Theme by Handel," two Scarlatti sonatas, one by Ginastera, and the Beethoven Sonata in A-flat.

A recital originally scheduled for Friday by Robert Hamilton has been postponed to March 8.

6. Encounters: A series of hour-long discussion programs focusing on the fine arts is being broadcast by WSND-FM, the Notre Dame fine arts station. Called "Encounters with the Arts," the series will run through April 1.

Each broadcast will be aired twice: on Sundays, from 5 to 6 p.m., and on Mondays, from 10 to 11 p.m. Members of the IUSB faculty and Michiana area artists are featured on the series, which is produced at IUSB. Harold R. Langland, Fine Arts, is program coordinator.
