# Indiana College Core (ICC)

- Formerly known as the State-wide Transfer General Education Core (STGEC).
- State statute mandated ([Senate Enrolled Act 182](#))
- The ICC enables a student who satisfactorily completes an approved program of general education in any one of Indiana's public institutions, including high school, to transfer that coursework to any other state educational institution as a block of 30 credit hours towards the general education core requirement.



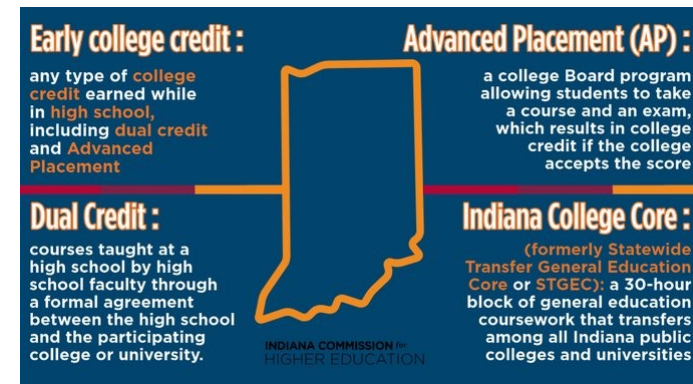
# Indiana College Core (ICC)

- The ICC is 30 credit hours based on competencies and learning outcomes in six areas:
  - Foundational Intellectual Skills
    - Written Communication
    - Speaking and Listening
    - Quantitative Reasoning
  - Ways of Knowing
    - Humanistic and Artistic
    - Scientific
    - Social and Behavioral



# Early College High School

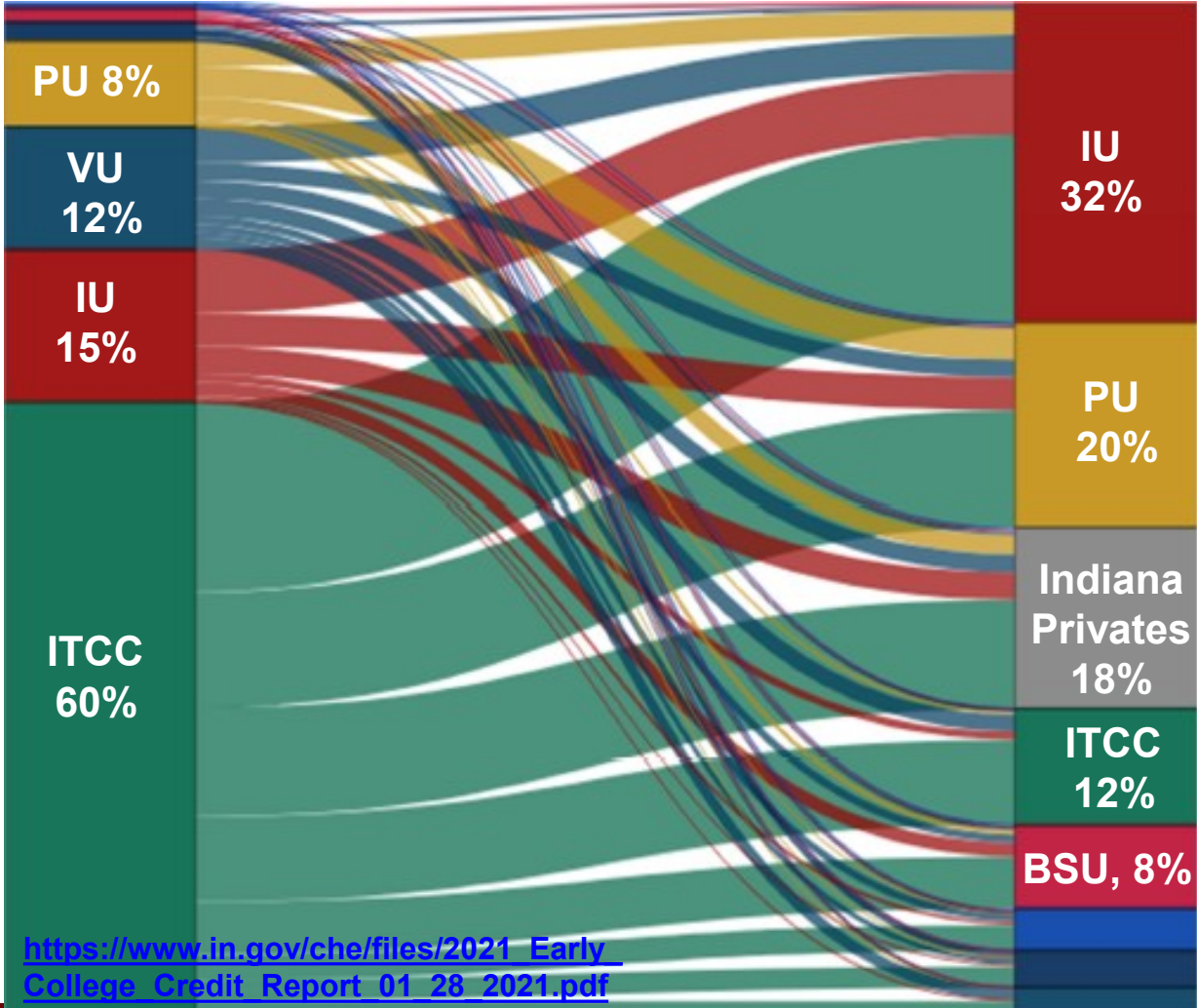
- Enables students of participating high schools (e.g., [MHS](#)) to earn two years of dual credit coursework schools and completion of
  - ❑ An associates degree approved by the ICHE.
  - ❑ The Indiana College Core (30 hours of general education coursework).
- MOU must be signed between the high school and an Indiana public, primary postsecondary partner.

# IU Indiana College Core (ICC) Certificate

- The IU ICC Certificate is an IU certificate that can be awarded to a high school student earning the ICC and at least 15 of the 30 ICC credit hours through IU coursework (ACP, on campus, or online).
- The certificate outlines the courses that high school students can take towards the certificate.
- The certificate is designed to be general and flexible regardless of which IU campus students enroll.
- Treat the certificate like an ICC milestone from another campus or institution.

# IU ICC Certificate Program Management

The IU Office of School Partnerships will hire a Program Management Specialist for each regional campus.

Responsibilities include:

- Coordinates directly with the ACP program, UTO, and the Campus in building the ICC curriculum maps with high schools;
- Works closely with the unit where the program is housed to develop and implement the program;
- Serves as the primary campus contact for participating high schools; and
- Tracks progress on deliverables and prepares reports for the unit where the program is housed.

# Request of the Academic Senate

Review the IU ICC Certificate proposed by the IU Office of School Partnerships and vote on the proposal at the November Academic Senate Meeting.

The proposal has been reviewed and discussed by the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate and Academic Affairs.

The proposal affords IU the opportunity to provide the State mandated ICC in an robust and flexible manner that should appeal to high schools and allow IU to have more control of the curriculum and quality.
