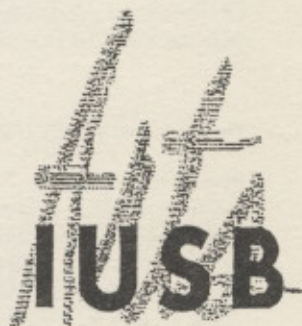

Christine Larson Seitz, pianist, was born in Pittsburgh. She earned a Bachelor of Music degree at Indiana University South Bend and is now a master's candidate in accompanying here. Chris currently serves as Academic Coordinator and music instructor at IUSB, teaches in the IUSB Academy and has been accompanist for the South Bend Symphonic Choir for the last 15 years. She is a free-lance accompanist and organist at the First United Methodist Church, Mishawaka. She and her husband, David, share a love of music and the Camerata Singers. David is the director; Chris the assistant director and accompanist.

Larry Priest has played clarinet in the Michiana area for many years. Born in Cincinnati, he came to Indiana to study at Indiana University School of Music in Bloomington, where he received the degree Bachelor of Music, Woodwinds. He has played in the 122nd Army Band at Fort Benning, Georgia; has performed with the Elkhart and South Bend Symphonies and the Elkhart Municipal Band; and is solo clarinetist in the Twin Cities Concert Band. As president of Blessing's Music, he has helped many young people develop their musical talents through band and orchestra instruments. Larry and his wife, Jody, reside in South Bend

Denise Kuehner, cellist, was born and raised in Evanston, IL. She went to Valparaiso University (where she met her husband, Eric) and received a Bachelor of Music Education degree. After five years of public school teaching and traveling among three North-west Indiana orchestras, she and Eric moved to South Bend where Denise received a Master's Degree in Performance and Literature from the University of Notre Dame.

She currently plays in the South Bend Symphony and Pops Orchestras, directs the Academy Youth Orchestra at IUSB, and teaches in the South Bend School Corporation.
