Westlaw Available for Walk-In Use

The Law Library in Bloomington recently subscribed to a version of Westlaw that is available to any walk-in patron. The service is called WestPAC and is available on six workstations in the Law Library lobby. WestPAC has several advantages over Lexis Academic in that one can conduct case searches over all fifty states and federal jurisdictions at once, including the use of the West Topic & Key Number System. Similarly, one can search all state administrative codes at once. In addition to all primary legal materials (cases, statutes, administrative codes), the service contains Amjur Legal Forms, American Law Reports, the Education Law Reporter, and the Amjur legal encyclopedia. The service provides electronic access to treatises in the areas of business, real property, personal injury, and family law. Furthermore, the service contains jury verdict reports for most states, including Indiana. For additional information contact Peter Hook, Electronic Services Librarian (pahook@indiana.edu).
