**Linda Cantara Receives the CSGS Masters Thesis Award For The Humanities and Arts*

Linda Cantara, the new Metadata Librarian at IU, has been selected to receive the 2002 Council of Southern Graduate Schools (CSGS) Masters Thesis Award for the Humanities and Arts. Linda's electronic thesis, "St. Mary of Egypt in BL MS Cotton Otho B. x: New Textual Evidence for an Old English Saint's Life" (<http://lib.uky.edu/ETD/ukyengl2001t00018/html/lcantara.htm>), was submitted in partial fulfillment of the requirements for a Master of Arts degree at the University of Kentucky in 2001 under the direction of Professor Kevin Kiernan, Department of English.

Each member institution was permitted to nominate one thesis submitted from Fall 2000 through Summer 2002. The entries were reviewed by faculty members from CSGS member institutions in the fields of Physical Sciences and Engineering or Humanities and the Arts, and were evaluated on the basis of clarity of style and presentation, scholarship, research methodology, and contributions to the field or discipline. The award includes a \$500 prize and travel expenses to attend the awards ceremony at the CSGS annual meeting in Tampa, Florida on February 23, 2003.

****Jenkins Award Nominations, IUB***

The William Evans Jenkins Award may be presented annually in recognition of truly outstanding contributions to the Indiana University Libraries or to the library profession in general by a present or former librarian. The award is based on one or more of the following criteria: (1) That the librarian has made a professional contribution which has had significant influence on the operations of the Indiana University Libraries; (2) That the librarian has made a significant professional contribution which earns the recognition of the University community; (3) That the librarian has made a significant contribution to the library profession which reflects achievement in librarianship at Indiana University; (4) That the librarian has shown excellence in service to the Indiana University Libraries as evidenced by continuous leadership and innovation. The following items may be used in support of the application: publications, research projects, grants, fellowships, teaching, guest lectures, consulting services, training workshops, and national, state, and local offices and chairs in the library field or related subject fields.

If you INTEND TO NOMINATE someone for the award this academic year, you need to send a message to this effect to Yolanda Cooper, Libraries Human Resources Officer (ycooperb@indiana.edu) by January 15, 2003. Please note that only this "intent to nominate" is due then. The nomination dossier itself is due by 31 January 2003.

The IUB Libraries purchased books to honor the service of Myles and Peg Brand on their departure from the university. Letters presented by Suzanne Thorin detailed the acquisitions and the reasons for their purchase:

[To Myles] As a heartfelt expression of our gratitude for your support of the IU Libraries, we have added the following books to the university's collections in your honor: *Aesthetics: Sources in the Nineteenth Century*, John V. Price, editor. This eight-volume set features the most important and least accessible Anglo-American 19th-century aesthetics texts.... Your steadfast support has benefited the IU Libraries immeasurably. Your advocacy for the construction of the Ruth Lilly Auxiliary Library Facility, your decision to name the Main Library in honor of Chancellor Wells, and your infusion of annual funds for our collections have served the university well.

[To Peg] In honor of your lasting influence on the academic community through your artistry, scholarship and commitment, the IU Libraries have added a distinctive artists book to the university's collections: *Limestone Lives: Voices from the Indiana Stonebelt* by IU M.F.A. student Kate Ferrucci. This limited-edition, hand-printed book pays tribute to Indiana limestone carvers with striking imagery and personal histories.

Peg responded with appreciation that the acquisitions were "such thoughtful gestures and so carefully chosen. What a wonderful way to remember: a new treasure or two for the library."
