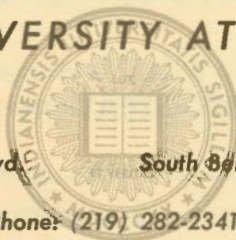

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. A Social Security number is necessary for registration. (THIS IS YOUR PERMANENT STUDENT NUMBER.)
2. Every student must have a permit to register and an enrollment card before he enters the registration line.
3. Permits to register will be available in N102 weekdays June 10 through June 18, 8:30-11:30 a.m.; 1-4:30 p.m.; and in the East Lobby of Northside Hall during registration.
4. Every student must have an enrollment card before he is issued a permit to register.
5. Enrollment cards must be obtained from the student's academic Division weekdays June 10 through June 18, 8:30-11:00 a.m.; 1:00-4:00 p.m.

6. STUDENTS FROM OTHER INDIANA UNIVERSITY CAMPUSES must request the office of the Dean or Chairman of their school or division to forward an inter-campus transfer form to the corresponding academic division at IUSB. Enrollment cards will be obtained at the office of the division to which the inter-campus transfer form was sent, and marked with the name of the Parent Campus.
7. TRANSFER STUDENTS (Those formally admitted to IUSB from other colleges or universities) must have their admission completed prior to May 15, 1971. Those who have been admitted prior to the May 15 deadline, will register with IUSB students. Transfer students please show admission letters to personnel issuing enrollment cards. Those transfer students whose admission has not been completed by May 15 will register with the transient students. Inquiries concerning admission should be directed to the Office of Admissions, Indiana University at South Bend, 1825 Northside Blvd., South Bend, Indiana 46615.
8. TRANSIENT STUDENTS (Guest students from other than I.U. campuses), AND SPECIAL STUDENTS will obtain their enrollment cards from the Office of Admissions. Transient students must present evidence of good standing from the last college attended.
9. Students auditing courses obtain enrollment cards from Admissions if this is a first enrollment at IUSB; from Academic Division if student has previously enrolled at any campus of Indiana University.
10. Graduate students will obtain enrollment cards in the following manner:
  - a. Students taking courses in Graduate Education or courses for teacher certification — Division of Education.
  - b. Students admitted to the Graduate School of Business — Division of Business and Economics.
  - c. Students in Graduate School of Music — Division of Music.
  - d. All other graduate students — Division of Arts and Sciences.
11. Fees are payable in full at the time of registration.
12. A late enrollment fee, \$5 for one course, \$10 for two or more courses, will be charged for all credit registration after June 22, 1971.

13. LATE DROP AND ADD (After June 30, 1971)

- a. Students who want to effect a change after June 30, 1971, will be charged a \$5 late fee for addition of a course.
- b. Waiver of the late fee is granted only when it can be demonstrably shown that the University through one of its offices or officials, is responsible for the late transaction.

14. No course may be added after the first week of a summer session unless the instructor of the course petitions that an exception be made and the request is approved by the chairman of the division in which the course is offered and the chairman of the division in which the student is registered.

15. Refunds are based on the date of the official withdrawal application as indicated in the IUSB Bulletin.

16. All courses are subject to cancellation.
