The primary clientele of the Life Sciences Library and the Chemistry Library are located in Jordan Hall, Myers Hall, and the Chemistry Building. When construction is completed in April of 2006 this will also include the Multidisciplinary Science Building.

Starting in September 2001, Brian was the Campus Library Coordinator in Indiana University Bloomington's Life Sciences Library where he supervised circulation, reserves, and stacks maintenance. He was the primary customer service provider in these areas, and he made a great impression on our users with his reference abilities and problem solving skills. Before holding this position, Brian was the Head of Circulation and Systems in the Alexandrian Public Library in Mount Vernon, Indiana, as well as the Evening Supervisor of the Rice Library at the University of Southern Indiana in Evansville.

Brian holds undergraduate degrees from Indiana University in Anthropology and Classical Studies, and studied Secondary Education at the University of Southern Indiana for certification to teach Latin. His MLS degree was completed in December 2003.

In his free time, Brian writes and records songs. He released a CD in 2004, and he performs regularly in and around Bloomington with his band.
