**EVENT:** Indianapolis Indians vs. Durham Bulls

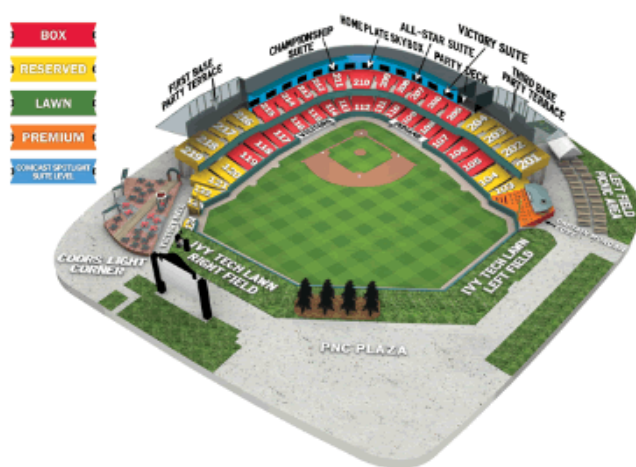
**DATE:** Friday, June 13

The second IU Librarians Health Sciences Summit will be held on **Tuesday, June 17** at the Ruth Lilly Medical Library in Indianapolis. Registration is free and open to *all* Indiana University librarians.

Please plan to attend the annual UnConference event hosted by the Academic Libraries of Indiana (ALI) Information Literacy Committee, which will focus on applying threshold concepts for information literacy instruction.

As outlined in [part 1](#) and [part 2](#) drafts, the Framework for Information Literacy for Higher Education crafted by the ACRL Task Force (to be introduced at the ALA Conference this June) is expected to be underpinned by threshold concepts theory. This year's ALI UnConference will focus on sharing and developing ideas amongst Indiana academic librarians for applying threshold concepts in information literacy instruction in different teaching situations, such as one-time library instruction, working with international students, reference, etc. Following the unconference model, attendees will identify the topics to be discussed through the day and work together to share examples and discuss options.
