Designing the Digital Scholarly Commons: "In Mrs. Goldberg's Kitchen: Jewish Life in Interwar Łódź"

The online Digital Scholarly Commons was inspired by the physical exhibition about the Jewish quarter in pre-WWII in Łódź, "In Mrs. Goldberg's Kitchen," which is on permanent display at the Central Museum of Textiles in Łódź, Poland. Created with Omeka, the Digital Commons reveals the multimedia and multilayered aspects of the exhibition, which are difficult to channel in a traditional museum setting. Omeka allows users to easily navigate a complex set of relationships. In order to create a comprehensive knowledge base, scholars from multiple academic disciplines will be invited to contribute interpretive essays and other materials. By fostering the creation of an online global community of scholars engaged in multidisciplinary projects, this project will promote new scholarship and collaborative ventures. Moreover, in its role as an educational resource, the Digital Commons will provide an innovative learning environment for students at various levels, and serve as a resource for teachers. The Digital Scholarly Commons offers new models of partnerships between institutions dedicated to preservation (museum/archive) and study (university) of the past.

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DPLA Indiana Meeting Announcement

On **Friday, March 6, 2015** the Indiana State Library will be hosting a planning meeting for Digital Public Library of America's (DPLA) Indiana Statewide Service Hub.

This meeting is open to all libraries, historical societies, museums and archives who are interested in participating in DPLA. To learn more about DPLA, click here to go the [website](#).

The DPLA is a national discovery tool for public domain and licensed digital content held by the nation's archives, libraries, museums, and other cultural heritage institutions. It is aimed at providing large scale public access to these local depositories. Indiana Memory has been accepted as a service hub for DPLA, providing a way for content from the local organizations to be included in the national database.

The purpose of this meeting is to update the State on our progress, including a report on our initial data upload, and to discuss potential governance models for Indiana's DPLA statewide service hub. This will include a conversation on the process the State Library has created for getting the existing records ready for harvesting as well as a timeline for adding new collections. The attendees will also discuss a schedule for future meetings and future steps for the group.

The DPLA Indiana meeting will take place on **Friday, March 6, 2015 1:00pm - 3:00pm** in the History Reference Room of the Indiana State Library.

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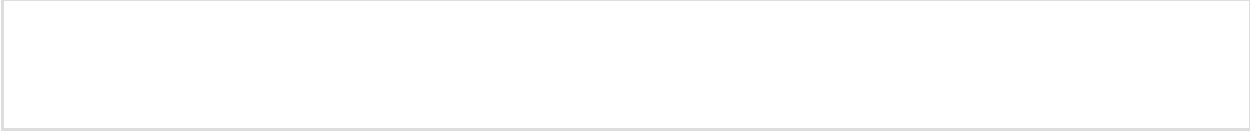
