The Indiana University Libraries are pleased to announce that Carrie Donovan has been appointed the Instructional Services Librarian in the Information Commons Undergraduate Library Services Department. In February 2006 Carrie became the Visiting Instructional Services Librarian after national search for the position. Carrie brings over 7 years of experience in Instruction, Information Literacy, and Reference services to this position. Carrie has been the Collection Manager for Gender Studies since August of 2006. She has held positions at the University of Southern Indiana and University of Missouri-Kansas City. She received her M.L.S. from Indiana University Bloomington (IUB) in 1999 and her Bachelor of Arts degree in Comparative Literature and Spanish in May from IUB as well.

Carrie currently represents the IUB Libraries as a member of the national Library Orientation Exchange (LOEX) Advisory Board and she is also an active member of the Indiana Library Federation Bibliographic Instruction/User Education Section and the Association of College and Research Libraries Instruction Section. Political Papers Specialist

Effective July 1, 2007 Kate Cruikshank, the Political Papers Specialist, will report to Cecile Jagodzinski, Director of Collection Development. Kate previously reported to Breon Mitchell, Director of the Lilly Library. Kate is responsible for the processing, arranging, and cataloging of modern political papers, the creation of guides to the collection, and promotion and outreach in support of the use of the papers. Kate was appointed the Political Papers Specialist in July 2004 and since then she has focused on completing the arrangement and description of the papers of former Representative Lee Hamilton and former Senator Birch Bayh. Kate's office will remain in GIMSS.

Moving Kate and her work with modern political papers from the Lilly Library is in anticipation of a review of special collections in the Wells Library and the development of enhanced services in support of these collections. The

University Archives and Records Management Department will relocate to Wells Library by the end of the fall 2007 semester. This will create the opportunity to include the Archives in the planning for special collections services in ways not possible when they were located in Bryan Hall. Planning is proceeding to move the Archives into the space formerly occupied by LIT in the east tower.

Journalism Library Update

Effective Monday, July 2, 2007, the Weil Journalism Library is closed for remodeling. All library materials have been removed from Ernie Pyle Hall and are in the process of being integrated into the collections of the Wells Library.

The Journalism Library is expected to reopen on August 27, 2007 with the School of Journalism assuming responsibility for the day-to-day operations and oversight of the space. The collections and services planned at that facility are currently under discussion.

The IUB Libraries will continue to select and purchase Journalism subject-related online and print materials (to be housed at Wells Library), offer librarian consultation, provide virtual services, and offer instruction in information fluency for the School of Journalism. Grace Jackson-Brown will continue to assist students and faculty as collection manager for Journalism and Telecommunications.

I would like to thank Grace, Linda Butler, Journalism Branch Library Coordinator, and the many, many people who assisted (and are continuing to assist) in making this a successful transition.
