Constitution of Magic the Gathering Club

Preamble

Magic the Gathering Club is a group dedicated to the benefit of the Magic community on and around the Indiana University Bloomington campus. We are here to ensure that anyone in the Bloomington area will be able to get their Magic fix with a nice friendly group of people within the formal lounges, residence halls, and other public and private locations at IU. Our organization hosts regular tournaments and other events, sanctioned or otherwise, on campus, for any format or variant, and at the best price we can offer. We are also open to feedback if you have any problems or changes you would like to make.

Article I: Membership

This organization has no limitations of membership and will not discriminate or deny members based upon race, age, gender, or sexual orientation. Furthermore this organization has no different classes of membership. To be admitted to this group one needs to simply add themselves to the club's Facebook page, as is it where a majority of the announcements are posted.

Article II: University Compliance

This organization shall comply with all Indiana University regulations, and local, state and federal laws.

Article III: Executive Officers

President - An individual wishing to hold the position of President does not need to meet any requirements except a desire to make sure the rest of the members of the organization are having a fun and safe time. However the President is responsible for reserving seats within the IMU for use during the semester OR deciding an alternative meeting place if rooms prove unavailable.

Vice President – An individual wishing to hold the position of Vice President does not need to meet any specific requirements except a desire to make sure the rest of the members of the organization are having a fun and safe time. However the Vice President is responsible for doing the responsibilities of the President if they are unable to do so.

Treasurer - An individual wishing to hold the position of Treasurer does not need to meet any specific requirements except a desire to make sure the rest of the members of the organization are having a fun and safe time. However the Treasurer is responsible for collecting money if/when the club hosts drafts or officially sanctioned Magic events.

Both of these positions will be held until the individual graduates or wishes to resign. Open positions will be filled via volunteer, and if more than one individual voices their desire to fill the position then the previous holder of the position will determine who takes their place.

Article IV: Advisor

The Advisor holds no higher responsibility than any other member of the organizations and are more than welcome to attend meetings. Advisors should serve until they are unable to, and more than one is allowed but not necessary.

Article V: Meetings

Magic the Gathering Club meets every Tuesday and Thursday from 7pm – 12am. Meetings will be posted to the Facebook page. Meetings have no official agenda or rules of order and attendance is not taken. This organization merely serves as a safe space for individuals to play the game Magic the Gathering.

Article VI: Elections

This organization does not hold formal elections as the Executive Officers are volunteer positions.

Article VII: Non-Hazing

Hazing is strictly prohibited. Hazing shall be defined as any conduct which subjects another person, whether physically, mentally, emotionally, or psychologically, to anything that may endanger, abuse, degrade, or intimidate the person as a condition of association with a group or organization, regardless of the person's consent or lack of consent.

Article VIII: Dues & Budgets

This organization does not have dues for membership. However there may be events where a fee must be paid in order to participate, such as drafts and mock prereleases. These events will be offered at price that is as low as possible. However the fee MUST be collected before the event. If an individual CANNOT PAY THEN THEY CANNOT PLAY. The Treasurer is responsible for collecting the event fees.

Article IX: Finances

The Treasurer is responsible of financial affairs. Currently, the organization does not maintain a Student Organization Account. If members of the organization wish to hold a draft, prerelease, etc then they are responsible for contacting the Treasurer and then giving them the fee to purchase a box, packs, or other sealed product. If the group dissolved then the remaining money may be allocated as the university sees fit.

Article X: Personal Gain Clause

This organization, if raising funds, shall ethically raise and distribute profits from organizational functions to either the organization or to members who provide a service that directly benefits the organization. Individual members may not receive compensation from for-profit companies if acting as a representative of a student organization.

Article XI: Amendments

Proposed Amendments to this Constitution will be discussed at group meeting with an advanced notice of the specific meeting being posted on the group's Facebook. At the meeting if a majority of the members find the Amendment agreeable (over ½ of the total present members) then the Amendment will be added to the Constitution.

Article XII: Ratification

The Constitution of Magic the Gathering Club as it currently is written was agree upon in the majority during the meeting held on 4/12/2018.
