"A Legacy of Honor: An Exhibition from the congressional Papers of Lee H. Hamilton" opened January 17, 2006 and runs through April 1, 2006 in the Lilly Library Main Gallery.

The exhibit lays out the major dimensions of Lee Hamilton's congressional career and provides a glimpse into the contents of his congressional papers. It is divided into three approximately equal areas of emphasis: Hamilton's relationships with and service to his ninth-district constituents; his ever-increasing role in foreign policy and foreign affairs; and a focus on the workings of Congress and Hamilton's lifelong commitment to making it the institution the founding fathers intended. This last emphasis extends the exhibit into Hamilton's ongoing post-Congressional career.

Lilly Library hours are 9 a.m. - 6 p.m. Monday - Friday, and 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. Saturday.

The Libraries' Diversity Committee is sponsoring a special program on "Diversity in the Workplace," presented by Dr. Carolyn Wietoff from the Department of Management, Kelly School of Business. She will give two presentations: 9:00-10:30 a.m. and 2:00-3:30 p.m. Both are scheduled for Wednesday, February 8, in Wells Library, E174.

As stated in the program announcement: "Diverse organizations can function well or function poorly. Diversity can create stress and conflict and can make everyone - those who are privileged as well as those who are less privileged - anxious and upset. Yet diverse work organizations can also function beautifully, gaining competitive advantage over homogenous organizations. When leaders "manage diversity" they engage in strategies and processes designed to make sure that differences among workers do not diminish, but rather enhance, organizational functioning.

Although attendance is not mandatory, it is requested that library staff members be allowed flexibility in their work schedules in order to attend, either the morning or afternoon presentation. I encourage all to participate in this important program and thank the Libraries' Diversity Committee for planning it.
