Since the presidency of Franklin Roosevelt, the first 100 days of an administration has been used as a measuring stick to estimate the ability of a new president to govern. This is still true today. The first 100 days of the Trump administration invoked strong sentiment both for and against his policies. However, was the sentiment generally positive or negative or neutral? Using different sentiment analysis algorithms and Trump's favorite social media platform, Twitter, we scraped over 181,000 English language tweets between January 20th, 2017 and April 29th, 2017 to get an idea of Twitter user sentiment regarding the new Commander-in-Chief during his first 100 days.

While our results reveal an interesting snapshot of the heightened emotions of the first 100 days of this presidency, they also raised some concerns regarding the bias inherent in the sentiment analysis process. More specifically, in the different dictionaries used to determine which words are "positive" and which words are "negative" issues of bias regarding race, gender, sexuality, and religion emerge. Therefore, it's important to "look underneath the hood," even when using a vetted dictionary, to examine the assumptions made, tweak the dictionary, and make transparent any assumptions left in the lexicon.

IUCAT Classic will be deactivated effective Sunday December 17th following the completion of the fall semester.

All of the major functions of the SirsiDynix user interface are now available via the IUCat Blacklight interface (<https://iucat.iu.edu>) including browse and course reserves. Alternate access for the few remaining staff-only functions that require the SirsiDynix OPAC will continue to be available (more details to come on this aspect).

Our communication plan regarding the retirement is as follows:

- Sept. 15: Information about the planned retirement date will be added to the IUCAT Classic login page. A note will be added to all relevant UITS Knowledge Base articles.
- Oct. 15: Banner announcing the retirement date will be added to IUCAT Classic. A notification will be added to the IT Notices calendar. A news item will be posted on the IU Bloomington Libraries' website.
- Nov. 15: Additional notifications added within IUCAT Blacklight interface regarding IUCAT Classic retirement.

Dr. Taemin Park Retirement

The following year she began her appointment as an Assistant Librarian in the Cataloging Section of Serials. In 1992 she attained the rank of Associate Librarian with tenure. In 1993 she completed the Ph.D. degree in Library and Information Science and began teaching cataloging courses as an Adjunct faculty member of the School of Library and Information Science. She has continued her teaching to the present, co-teaching cataloging courses for the last three years with Andrea Morrison.

Beginning soon she will be in Maryland where her daughter lives. Taemin will be the proud (and busy) grandmother of three young girls there.
