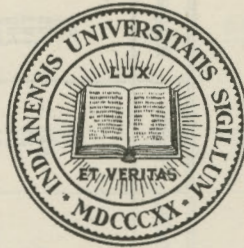

NOTE: Additional courses may be added if there is adequate demand and an appropriately qualified teacher is available. The above schedule is subject to change or cancellation of particular courses if enrollment is inadequate or if instructors become unavailable. The fees indicated above are for residents of Indiana. For detailed information concerning course descriptions, study programs, admissions, fees, withdrawals, etc., see the Annual Bulletin, copies of which are available at the Center.

The time for both class and office schedules will be the prevailing time in South Bend at the beginning of the Summer Session. The Center reserves the right to change the announced schedule for class and office hours if such becomes desirable to meet the convenience and needs of students.

ENROLLMENT AND FEES. The regular Enrollment period begins June 12 and continues through June 14 after which a late enrollment fee of \$2 is added. Early enrollment is advised since classes will be limited in size. Fees must be paid in full at the time of enrollment and are at the rate of \$7 per semester hour for residents of Indiana and \$10 per semester hour for non-residents. In laboratory courses an additional fee is charged. No change may be made in enrollment status until June 16 and application therefor must be made in writing on form available at the office. (See below regarding enrollment hours.)

ADMISSION. Admission requirements of the Center should be checked by the students in the Annual Bulletin for 1949-50. Briefly these are: Students with no previous college work must file application for admission to Indiana University. Students transferring to the Center from either the Bloomington campus or another university are asked to file at the time of their enrollment a statement indicating good standing with their school. Enrollments will be contingent upon clearance of admission credentials before the end of the fifth week of classes. Adults wanting to take work on non-degree programs will enroll as Special Students in which instance formal admission is not required.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING. An academic counselor will be available both during the enrollment period and during the Summer Session to assist students in planning their programs. Seven to nine hours constitute a regular full-time program; those employed full time should generally not take more than a two- or three-hour course. Students should make certain that appropriate prerequisites have been met for the courses in which they wish to enroll. Orientation tests will be offered June 29, 7-10 p.m., and August 28, 9 a.m.-12 m. Reservations to take these may be made in the office of the academic counselor.

WITHDRAWALS. All students withdrawing from any class should make application in the Center office for an official withdrawal. Unless this is done the student automatically receives a grade of F. **LIMITED** refunds available upon approved withdrawals until July 8 only.

VETERANS. Under present procedure veterans (except P.L. 16 veterans) enrolled at the Center or on the Bloomington campus during the academic year 1949-50 are required to re-certify on V.A. Form 7-1909 to enroll for the Summer Session unless they were enrolled elsewhere during the second semester or unless they are changing their course of study. Veterans changing their course of study are required to secure a supplemental certificate. All other veterans should secure either an original or supplemental certificate of eligibility and time entitlement from the Veterans Administration in advance of enrollment. Veterans lacking such authorization will be required to pay for fees and books but same will be refunded during the session upon presentation of appropriate authorization and receipts covering fees paid and books purchased. Veterans having special questions should consult with the local Veterans Administration office on the sixth floor of the Whitcomb and Keller Building. All veterans enrolled under P.L. 16 must check with that office before enrolling.

SMOKING. Both state law and high school policy have certain regulations regarding smoking which must be observed. The registration of any student who refuses to observe such regulations may be canceled with full forfeiture of credit and without financial consideration.

OFFICE AND LIBRARY HOURS DURING THE SUMMER SESSION. Office hours Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m., and 6:30-8:30 p.m.; and Friday, 9 a.m.-4:30 p.m. No Saturday hours. The University Center Library will be open Monday through Thursday, 12:30-8:30 p.m., and Friday, 1-5 p.m.

During the Enrollment period, June 12 through June 14, enrollment hours will be 12 m.-4 p.m. and 6-8:30 p.m. Starting June 15 late enrollments may be made during scheduled afternoon and evening hours. Students should make special note that there will be no morning hours for enrollment.
