***Halls of Residence Libraries Update**

Management of the Halls of Residence Libraries will officially transfer from the IUB Libraries/HRL to Residential Programs & Services (RPS) on July 1, 2001. Staff in the Halls of Residence Libraries are working closely with staff from RPS on transition planning.

Because a great deal of time is needed to dismantle the collections, all HRLs will be closed by May 4. (Apartment Housing Library will be closed on June 14.) This will allow sufficient time to pack up books, to disconnect and relocate computers, and in general, to provide for an orderly transition to new management.

Elinor Okada will continue as the HRL contact for bills and fines. Sheila Hoff and Jo McClamrock will be coordinating the transfer of selected materials to the Main Library.

RPS will continue to provide "full service libraries" at Apartment Housing, Collins, Eigenmann, Foster, Teter, and Willkie residence centers. At these locations, books, music, and videos will be available to patrons.

RPS will develop centers for lending movies and music at Ashton, Briscoe, Forest, McNutt, Read, and Wright residence centers.

We wish RPS every success in this endeavor.

***IUPUI University Library Staff Create Government Website**

What do the Congressional Quarterly, National Library of Australia and the Pentagon Library share in connecting with the IUPUI University Library? They have all recently joined public libraries and academic libraries from around the globe in adding a unique resource link to their Internet websites, Abbreviations and Acronyms of the U.S. Government, created and maintained by Kelly Smith, of the University Library Reference Team.

Hundreds of agencies of the federal government are actually known more commonly by their acronym than by their full name. Examples include the CDC, IRS, and NAFTA. The University Library page was designed to help clear up some of the frustration often encountered in trying to decipher the real names of government entities.

Located at www.ulib.iupui.edu/subjectareas/gov/docs_abbrev.html, the site provides the unique element of direct links to the Internet website for each of the more than 600 agencies, programs and publications listed. In a recent assessment of the month of March 2001, the site received over 6100 hits, representing all domain types (.com, .edu, .gov, etc.) and 20 different countries from around the world.
