Recently the IU Libraries has seen major progress in managing born digital materials within some of the special collections units. The Born Digital Preservation Lab, established in January 2016, has been developing workflows to image and preserve obsolete media. The University Archives has been a strong partner in establishing end-to-end management of born digital materials, as they have revised accessioning and processing workflows, collaborated with the BDPL on pre-ingest, and have begun working on issues like backlog processing, providing access to researchers, and working with record creators to establish optimal acquisition of digital records.

This presentation will discuss how the BDPL and University Archives have been working on these larger challenges. We will also highlight a few current projects, including a collaboration between the BDPL and Media Services to image and provide access to a collection of obsolete PC games.

### Diane Bever Retires

Diane Bever will retire on February 28, 2017 after 38 years of service to Indiana University! Diane began her professional career at IU Kokomo Library after receiving the Master of Library Science from Indiana University in 1979. In her 38 years at IU Kokomo, Diane has served as Assistant Reference Librarian, Head of Reference Services, Head of Public Services, Interim Dean of the Library and (currently) Reference and Information Services Librarian. Along the way, she added Archivist responsibilities to her position description.

Diane's contributions to the IU Kokomo Library, to the Kokomo campus and to Indiana University are innumerable. Throughout her career, Diane has played a pivotal role in public services at IU Kokomo Library and Diane is the institutional memory for, not only our Library, but for the campus and the university, as well. Beyond Indiana University, Diane has a distinguished, and influential, record of service in the library profession. She is a tireless volunteer and since 1977 she has been especially active in the Indiana Library Federation (ILF). In 1992 Diane received the ILF Leadership Award and last October (2016) she was honored with the organization's Lifetime Achievement Award. For all that she has accomplished and contributed while at Indiana University Kokomo, Diane was promoted to Librarian rank in 1996. She was the first librarian on the IU Kokomo campus to obtain that rank and is one of two full rank librarians at IU Kokomo, ever.

## Diane Dallis to Leave IU Libraries

Dear Library Colleagues,

It is with mixed feelings that I write today to announce that Diane Dallis has accepted the position of Associate University Librarian for Research and Learning at the University of Chicago. Diane's accomplishments are numerous and far reaching within the libraries and beyond. She has been a transformative leader in the development of innovative spaces and services and in creating partnerships within the libraries, on campus, and off.

Diane led the projects to create the Learning Commons, Scholars' Commons, and Moving Image Collections and Archives area. Each project transformed not only the space, but also the service model. Diane directed the planning of a Big Ten Academic Alliance conference, "Repackaging for the Future: A Conversation about Services, Space, and the New Library." The conference brought our colleagues to Wells Library to view our renovations, which served as a model for discussions about designing new spaces and services.

At the all-staff meetings this week Diane spoke about our assessment activities, a program she has championed. With the knowledge we are gaining about how our spaces and services are used, we can make, for the first time, informed-data decisions about the services we offer current and future users. Diane created instructional development grants for the design or revision of undergraduate and graduate courses that integrate information literacy. She worked with Advancement to develop a proposal that led to a substantial gift from the Jay Family to fund the program.

Diane is a generous colleague who has served as a mentor to the many students and librarians she worked with while at IU. She seeks out partnerships and collaborators, such as the Vice Provost for Undergraduate Education, Associate Vice Provost for Research and the Arts and Humanities Council, the Center of Excellence for Women in Technology, Mathers Museum, and UITS Teaching and Learning that have led to the development of new programs and increased visibility for the libraries.

In a message like this, it is impossible to capture all of the ways that Diane has contributed to the success of the Libraries. Diane leaves a legacy of innovation, creativity, and collegiality for us to build upon. If there is a positive aspect to this, it is that Chicago is a member of the Big Ten Academic Alliance Center for Library Initiatives so we will still reap the benefits of her leadership within the Big Ten.

Diane's last day will be April 14, 2017. Before she leaves IU and the Libraries, we will find a proper Hoosier way to wish her luck and to send her off to Chicago.
