Olga Pushechnikova was born in Moscow in 1975 to a family of musicians. She is a graduate of the Central Musical School at Moscow Conservatoire, studying with E. Timakin. In 1987 Olga became the Laureate of the International Youth Competition "Prague Concertino" (Czechoslovakia). In 1993 she won the first prize in the First International Piano Competition named after Rachmaninoff, and was the the 1996 Laureate of the VIII Unisa Transnet Piano Competition in Pretoria, South Africa.

Presently Olga Pushechnikova is a fourth year student of Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatoire in the class of Professor Sergei Dorenski. Olga is a soloist with the Moscow State Philharmonic Society, and is a correspondent member of the International Academy of Arts. She frequently tours Russia and abroad, giving performances in Poland, Finland, Bulgaria, France, Spain, Germany, the U.S. and Japan, and has appeared as a soloist with many of the world's finest orchestras.

Dmitrij Teterin was born in Moscow in 1971, and began his piano studies at the age of six at the Central Music School under Mndojanz and subsequently at the the Moscow P.I. Tchaikovsky State Conservatory under Manlin and Osipova.

Mr. Teterin has performed in solo recitals, chamber ensembles and with orchestras in Russia, Poland, Bulgaria, Greece, South Africa, Canada and the U.S.A. He was the guest artist for Mikhail Gorbachev during his Canadian tour. His performances bring rave reviews from both audiences and presenters.

In 1996, he won the Second Prize at the Unisa Transnet International Music Competition in Pretoria, South Africa. He was also awarded the Special Prize for Chopin and the Special Prize for Contemporary South African Composition.

He has participated in many other competitions, taking Third prize in the 1995 Cleveland International Piano Competition, the Second Prize silver medal in the prestigious Gina Bachauer International Piano Competition in Salt Lake City, Utah, as well as the 1992 "Special Promise Award" at the Ester Honens International Piano Competition in Calgary, Canada at the age of twenty. This award is granted to "a young artist who demonstrates unique talent, sensitivity and virtuosity with promise of future brilliance."

Dmitrij Teterin currently pursues scholarship studies with Sergei Babayan at The Cleveland Institute of Music.

As a courtesy to the artists and to other members of the audience, latecomers will be seated at an appropriate time. For the same reasons, return to seating following intermission should be prompt. Attendance by children under the age of responsible behavior is discouraged. Audio and video recording equipment, cameras, cellular phones and other electronic devices may not be used at a performance in any auditorium of IUSB. Eating and drinking in the Campus Auditorium, Recital Hall and Upstage are prohibited. Smoking is not permitted in any building of Indiana University South Bend.
