HISTORY OF INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND

Una Mae Reck is the fourth chancellor to lead Indiana University South Bend since it was founded on the shores of the St. Joseph River more than 40 years ago. Like the river itself, IU South Bend is a focal point for the region – serving more than 7,500 students from north central Indiana and southwestern Michigan.

Each year, more than 1,000 students graduate with associate, bachelor's or master's degrees from one of the more than 100 academic programs offered on the IU South Bend campus. These new graduates join more than 27,000 others who proudly claim IU South Bend as their alma mater.

As the student body has grown over the years, so has the campus. From a classroom in Central High School in 1916, to the construction of Northside Hall in 1961, and the dedication of the Student Activities Center in 2002, the IU South Bend campus has evolved to accommodate the educational needs of its students and the community.

IU South Bend also is committed to supporting and nurturing quality teaching and research within the faculty. Today, more than 260 full-time faculty and more than 260 part-time faculty guide students in their intellectual pursuits.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES CENTER

The Student Activities Center is home to the IU South Bend Titans athletic program, which compete in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference (CCAC).

The 100,000-square-foot Student Activities Center opened in early 2002 and it changed the campus mood immediately. Racquetball, basketball, and weight training began filling time between classes.

The goal was to design a building to be functional for student events and meetings, and to create informal interaction between faculty and students. The dream of an activities center that brings and keeps students on campus was achieved.

Architect Jack Plennert of Architecture Design Group (ADG) said the building was designed to be mindful of the hierarchy of education – it should not be taller than any academic building on campus.

The abundance of windows from the atrium to the weight room makes the building inviting from the outside. The campus scenery is brought inside with the windows along the suspended running track. "The building was designed to be nearly transparent" so people could see in and through, Plennert said. "It is a showcase for the campus."

The design was selected as the Outstanding Building for the American School and University's 2002 Interiors Showcase.

ADG was formed in 1988 by Jed Eide and Plennert. The firm now has a staff of 11 architects and designers. In addition to the IU South Bend Student Activities Center, ADG designed the Rolfs Sports Recreation Center at the University of Notre Dame and facilities for Saint Mary's College, the Culver Academies, and the Catholic Diocese of Fort Wayne–South Bend.



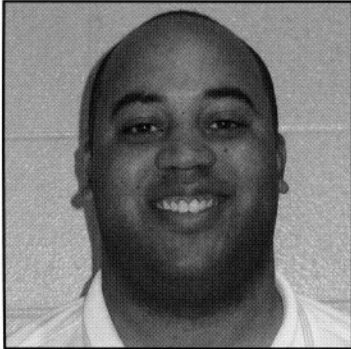

Micah Shrewsberry >> Hanover '99

Micah Shrewsberry joined the Marshall men's basketball staff in the summer of 2003 as the director of basketball operations.

His duties included film exchange and breakdown, scouting tapes on Marshall and the Thundering Herd's opponents, on-campus recruiting, recruiting mailouts, academic monitoring, and working Marshall's fall clinics and summer camps.

Prior to his stint at Marshall, he served as an assistant coach for two seasons at DePauw University. He helped lead the Tigers to the NCAA Division III Elite Eight, a number two ranking nationally in the 2001-02 season, and coached the Player of the Year both seasons. During his time at DePauw, his teams put together a 42-12 record and won two Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships.

Before DePauw, Shrewsberry was an assistant coach with Wabash College for one season.

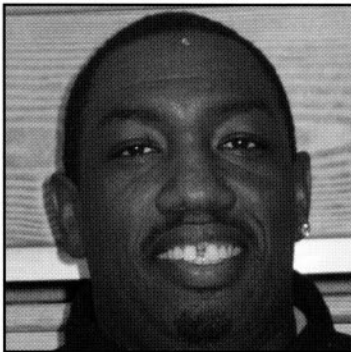
Shrewsberry's first season in collegiate coaching was with the University of Indianapolis, where he handled the duties of scouting opponents, recruiting, film exchange and breakdown, and strength and conditioning as an assistant coach.

Shrewsberry was a three-year starter for Hanover College, and was a part of one NCAA Tournament team in 1996. He was an all-conference nominee and a tri-captain in 1998-99.

He is currently a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the Black Coaches Association.

He graduated from Hanover in 1999 with a degree in physical education and earned a master's degree in sports management from Indiana State University in 2003.

Shrewsberry is married to the former Molly Maguire of Indianapolis. The couple resides in South Bend and they have a son, Braeden, who was born in February 2005.

Jason enters his first season as an assistant coach at IU South Bend. Jason is a native of Niles, Mich. and graduate of Niles-Brandywine High.

In 1991, Jason started an AAU organization called the Michiana Thoroughbreds. In 2003, he combined his program with the South Bend Martin Luther King Center program to form an 18 and under AAU team called the True Soldiers.

Brian enters his first season as an assistant coach at IU South Bend. Brian is a native of Niles, Mich. and graduate of Jimtown High.

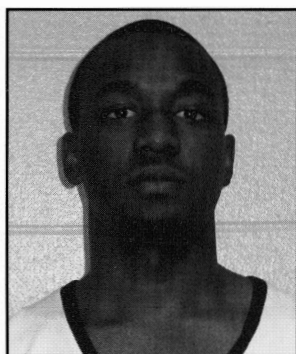

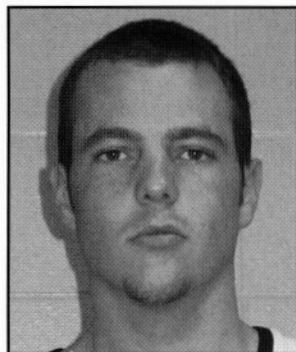
#10 Will Bolden >> 6'0 Senior Guard >> South Bend, Indiana, >> Lasalle High School

RECAP OF 2004-2005 SEASON

The Titans completed their season last year with an 11-22 record. The Titans finished sixth in the CCAC conference with a 3-9 record in conference play.

The Titans started off the season rocky losing their first six of out seven games. The one win, however, was an impressive win in the King College Tournament against the host team King College. IU South Bend defeated King College 53-36. The Titans went on to win their next six out of nine games including winning both games in the Inaugural Titan Classic defeating IU East 82-54 and Taylor University, Fort Wayne 94-81. The Titans came within two games of the .500 mark but lost their next five in a row before defeating Illinois Tech 58-54.

The Titans played perhaps their best game of the season on University of St. Francis' senior night. The Titans battled every second of the game. The game went back and forth the entire second half, with 20 seconds to go in the game Will Bolden hit a pull up jumper to give the Titans a one point lead. The Saints took the lead right back to go ahead by one; Bolden got fouled with 4 seconds left and calmly sank two free throws to win the game.

A NEW TITAN ERA BEGINS!

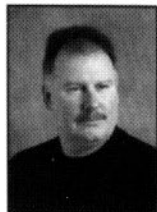
The veteran Titans will enter the 2005-2006 season led by rookie head coach Micah Shrewsberry. The Titans return 10 letter winners from last year's CCAC sixth place team.

There is guarded optimism in South Bend. Leading the Titans revival will be the all-time career assist leader senior Will Bolden (South Bend, IN). Bolden averaged 10.2 points per game and 4.7 assists per game. Joining Bolden on the perimeter will be senior Tony Patterson (Argos, IN), Scott McNeil (Plymouth, IN) and juniors Dustin O'Dell (Argos, IN), Hubert Gentry (South Bend, IN) and Bill Robertson (Argos, IN). O'Dell is a tremendous threat beyond the arc; he made 81 three pointers last year shooting 40 percent. Patterson second on the team with 52 three pointers made will provide another threat alongside O'Dell. McNeil gives the Titans a lot of strength on the perimeter; he is a good shooter who plays tough, hard-nosed defense. McNeil was third on the team with 32 three pointers made. At 5'9 Gentry is the most athletic player on the team and arguably the CCAC conference. Gentry was second on the team in offensive rebounds (50), defensive rebounds (105) and total rebounds (155). Robertson rounds out a solid group of perimeter players who provide depth for this guard heavy team.
