1. 68°: In order to conform with governor's-office directives on conserving energy, IUSB thermostats this week have been set back to 68 degrees from the former 72-degree level.

The use of electricity will also be curtailed wherever possible; for example, selected banks of lamps in hallways will be kept unlit in areas where no safety problems will result. Faculty and staff members are asked to be alert to opportunities to curtail electrical usage.

2. Slowdown: Indiana University vehicles have been limited to a speed of 50 miles an hour in compliance with a directive from the governor's office affecting state-owned cars. All persons using University wagons are asked to respect that limit.
3. Fee Hike: The Indiana Commission for Higher Education has approved an I.U. request to increase regional campus fees by 5 per cent per credit hour, effective next fall. In-state, undergraduate fees will thus become \$21 per credit hour if the HEC decision is ratified by the State Budget Agency. Bloomington fees will go up \$20 per semester next year for in-state students.
4. Zetterling Film: The opening event in a three-week series dealing with "Women in the Arts" will occur at 8:15 p.m. today in N158. It is a screening of the Mai Zetterling film "The Girls." Two additional Zetterling films will be exhibited in December. Dr. Gloria Kaufman, English, will offer a commentary on tonight's film.
5. Dr. Massoud: Marcos F. Massoud, Business Administration, has completed requirements for the Ph. D. degree at New York University. His dissertation is titled "Management Systems: A Comparative Study."
6. Workshop: The second workshop in French pronunciation (French phonetic) will take place Nov. 27 in N055 between 12 and 12:45 p.m. Topic: French vowels and consonants.
7. Pre-Dental Meeting: Pre-dental students at IUSB will have an opportunity to talk to Mrs. Rebecca Snyder, of the I.U. School of Dentistry, on Friday, December 7. She will discuss admission procedures and requirements in N066 from 1 to 3 p.m.

7. Faculty Activities: Dr. Gerald O. Dudley, Education, served as coordinator for a testing conference in South Bend Nov. 8 and 9. The conference was sponsored by the Houghton-Mifflin Co. for public school personnel from Northern Indiana. He also acted as a presenter, speaking on "Assessment in Career Education." Last Tuesday, Dr. Dudley spoke at a "Women in Careers" meeting which was part of the community's "National Career Guidance Week" observance.

Elaine Gottlieb Hemley, English, read a paper on Isaac Bashevis Singer to the Sisterhood of Sinai Synagogue last week. On November 28, she will present an expanded version of the talk as part of IUSB's "Women in the Arts" series. Mr. Singer is scheduled to speak at IUSB on February 14.
