This very important working group is being asked to consider whether or not the PCC should rescind the requirement of creating an 830 field when the only difference in the series is in the form of numbering. Their final report is due to the PCC by October 15th.

Dr. Pourciau, Director of Libraries at the University of Memphis, received the Ph.D. degree from Indiana University in 1975. He has recently given papers on information literacy at conferences in Hungary and the Netherlands; chaired two workshops offered by the International Library, Information, and Analytical Center in Washington, D.C.; and is currently chair of the Association of Southeastern Research Libraries. The SLIS Library has a bulletin board display about Dr. Pourciau which includes more information about his career and accomplishments.
