The landscape of open access publishing continues moving beyond scholarly journals. The IU Office of Scholarly Publishing (OSP)—a collaboration between Scholarly Communication at the IU Libraries and Indiana University Press—leverages new tools and digital technologies to facilitate the open dissemination of data, 3D objects, and eTexts. Several of these innovations are supported by our new workflow for XML-first publishing, making publishing in HTML and EPUB formats also possible.

In this talk, representatives from the OSP will share an overview of open access publishing trends generally and OSP work specifically. Join us to learn more about how these innovations are shaping open access publishing at Indiana University by making it more accessible, versatile, and interoperable.

Greetings all, I'm back again for your monthly reminder that IUCAT Classic will be deactivated effective Sunday, December 17 (following the completion of the fall semester).

On November 15 we will add a notification within the IUCAT Blacklight interface 'Tools' menu, adjacent to the link to IUCAT Classic about the deactivation.

Following the retirement of Classic through the end of spring semester 2018, visitors to <http://classic.iucat.iu.edu> will reach a page that describes options available via the IUCAT Blacklight interface and directs them there.

All of the major functions of the SirsiDynix user interface are now available via the IUCat Blacklight interface (<https://iucat.iu.edu>) including browse and course reserves. We will continue to provide access for generating a SirsiDynix PIN (the remaining staff-only function that requires the SirsiDynix OPAC) through an alternate venue. Instructions for accessing this function post-Classic will be shared later this semester.

Thus far, we have added a banner announcing the retirement date will be added to IUCAT Classic; posted the information on the IT Notices calendar; posted a news item on the IU Bloomington Libraries' website; and sent multiple notifications, like this one, to staff statewide. If we can help provide you with information that you can use to notify your patrons about the planned retirement of IUCAT Classic, or if you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me directly (crgreene@indiana.edu, 812-855-4217).

We are very excited to announce that Scott Shoger accepted the position of Visiting Librarian (Archivist) at the Schurz Library beginning Wednesday, November 1. Scott is a native to Indiana and an IU alumna, having earned his Bachelor of Arts in Comparative Literature from Indiana University, Bloomington. His MLIS, with a certificate in Archives and Cultural Heritage Resources and Services is from Dominican University in River Forest, Illinois. For the last 10 months, Scott worked at the National Park Service (NPS) in Washington, D.C., first as an intern and later as a American Conservation Experience fellow. He established procedures for receiving, processing, and facilitating access to NPS records as well as described, digitized and uploaded over 1,000 documents to their digital depository. He also gained archival and digitization experience at the Repertoire International de la Press Musicale (RIPM) at the Library of Congress, WFMT radio in Chicago, the Oriental Institute at the University of Chicago, and the Studs Terkel Radio Archive.
