INDIANA UNIVERSITY STUDENTS: Students planning to complete an undergraduate degree at Indiana University must have a permit to register.

TRANSIENT STUDENTS: Prior to registration, students from another accredited college or university who plan to enroll at a regional campus must submit evidence of good standing at the institution last attended, or an official letter authorizing enrollment in specific courses.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE: A non-refundable student activity fee for the support of cultural, recreational, and social programs at the South Bend Campus must be paid at the time of registration by all students enrolling for credit.

Fees shown are for Indiana residents; non-residents should add \$3.00 per credit hour. No refunds after July 1.
