Mathematics I: General Mathematics (M., 8-9:30 p.m., 16 meetings, Rm. 115, Hudson, \$20) Review of the fundamental arithmetic operations.

Vocabulary Improvement (M., 6:30-8 p.m., 16 meetings, Rm. 115, Bohan, \$20) Principles governing vocabulary; SAT vocabulary drill; techniques to overcome individual spelling weaknesses.

Typing Laboratory* (M., 6:30-8 p.m., Rm. 111 John Adams, 16 meetings, Mr. Adams, \$20) Remedial work to develop speed and accuracy in typing. For typists having beginning training.
