Exploratory Talks: Chancellor Wolfson announced Monday, in a public statement, that officials of Indiana University and of the Associates Corporation of North America are exploring the possibility of their mutual interest in making arrangements under which facilities currently occupied by Associates in South Bend, adjacent to IUSB, might be acquired by the University.

These exploratory talks between major officials of the University and Associates include an examination of the high priority needs of the South Bend campus, the timetable suitable for both the University and Associates, and the details of financing.
