GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Social Security Account Number is necessary for registration. **This is your permanent student number.**
2. All courses are subject to cancellation.
3. Fees payable in full at time of registration.
4. A fee of \$8 per credit hour more than the listed in-state resident fee will be paid by nonresidents of Indiana taking graduate or undergraduate courses.
5. A late enrollment fee of \$3 will be charged for all credit registration after Tues., June 17, 1969.
6. Refunds are based on the date of the official withdrawal application as indicated in the South Bend Regional Campus bulletin.
7. Prospective regular students must apply for admission to Indiana University and be admitted before registration. All students must present their permit to register at registration.
8. Transfer students from other than Indiana University campuses and any student not previously registered must submit their applications for admission by May 15, 1969.
9. Junior Division students from other Indiana University campuses must present evidence of good standing to the Office of the Junior Division, South Bend Campus. Upper Division students from other Indiana University campuses must present evidence of good standing to the Office of the Assistant Dean, South Bend Campus.
10. Transient students must present evidence of good standing (i.e., a 2.0 average on a 4.0 system or its equivalent) from the college last attended. This evidence should be sent to the Admissions Office before May 15th. All inquiries concerning admission should be directed to the Admissions Office, South Bend Campus.
11. An extensive counseling program is available at the South Bend Campus. Interviews are usually by appointment only. Students and others may make appointments by telephone (282-2341) or in person at the counseling office (Room 108) Northside hall between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Fridays.
