**James Bowyer** is an assistant professor of music at Indiana University South Bend where he conducts the IU South Bend Chamber Choir and IU South Bend Chorale; teaches courses in choral studies, voice, and aural skills; and serves as musical director for the main stage musical productions. He recently relocated from Brooklyn, N.Y. where he was assistant professor of music and director of choral activities at Brooklyn College and conductor of the professional choir at St. Boniface Church. He previously taught on the music faculties of the University of Wyoming, the University of Puget Sound, and Gonzaga University. James Bowyer studied conducting with Joseph Flummerfelt and James Jordan, and voice from Marvin Keenze. He earned the Doctor of Musical Arts in choral conducting from the University of Washington and the Master of Music in choral conducting, voice performance & pedagogy, and music education from Westminster Choir College. A graduate of Manchester College and Indiana native, he has taught music in both public, private, and charter school settings. He is a contributing author to the *Teaching Music Through Performance in Choir* series (GIA). His textbook *Creative Sight-singing* (Santa Barbara Music Press, 2008) has been adopted by high schools and colleges across the United States and Canada.

Active as collaborative pianist, chamber musician and soloist, **Mariah Mlynarek** serves as the visiting assistant professor of music at Indiana University South Bend. Studying with Martin Katz, Logan Skelton, and Katherine Collier, Mariah completed her M.M. and D.M.A. at the University of Michigan in collaborative piano.

Mariah has performed the Mendelssohn and Ravel piano concertos with orchestras, as well as solo and collaborative recitals featuring singers and instrumentalists. She has had the opportunity to work closely with composers Michael Daugherty, Gabriela Frank, and Evan Chambers premiering and exploring new music. As an opera enthusiast, Mariah has performed and coached Puccini's *La Boheme*, Humperdinck's *Hänsel und Gretel*, Donizetti's *L'elisir d'amore*, and Mozart's *Così fan Tutte*, working with conductors Martin Katz and Mark Gibson. Passionate about the revitalization of the arts in Detroit, she has joined with chamber partners Dennis Carter (fl), Lisa Raschiatore (cl), and Jennifer Goltz (voice) to perform at the jazz and art space Trinosophes. She also has joined in numerous opera outreach programs to bring opera to elementary schools throughout the Detroit area.
