The Indiana University Trustees recently announced their annual recognition of faculty academic contributions, and Maymanat Montaser Jafari, Librarian, University Library was the recipient of a 2000 Trustees Teaching Award. This recognition represents one of the few provided to honor the instructional contribution made by librarians as librarians.

In providing his nomination, David Lewis, Dean of the IUPUI University Library stated, "Ms. Jafari has been actively engaged in instructional activities both in campus learning communities and at more advanced levels. She has been the sole librarian working with the Purdue University School of Engineering and Technology, Indianapolis,

providing creative integration of library skills and information literacy components throughout the school's curriculum."
