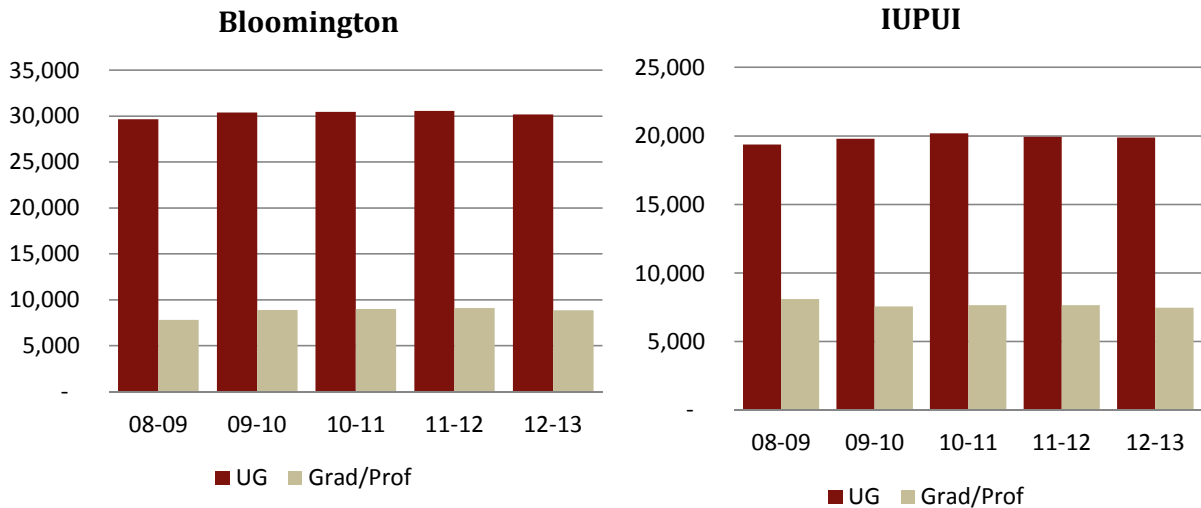

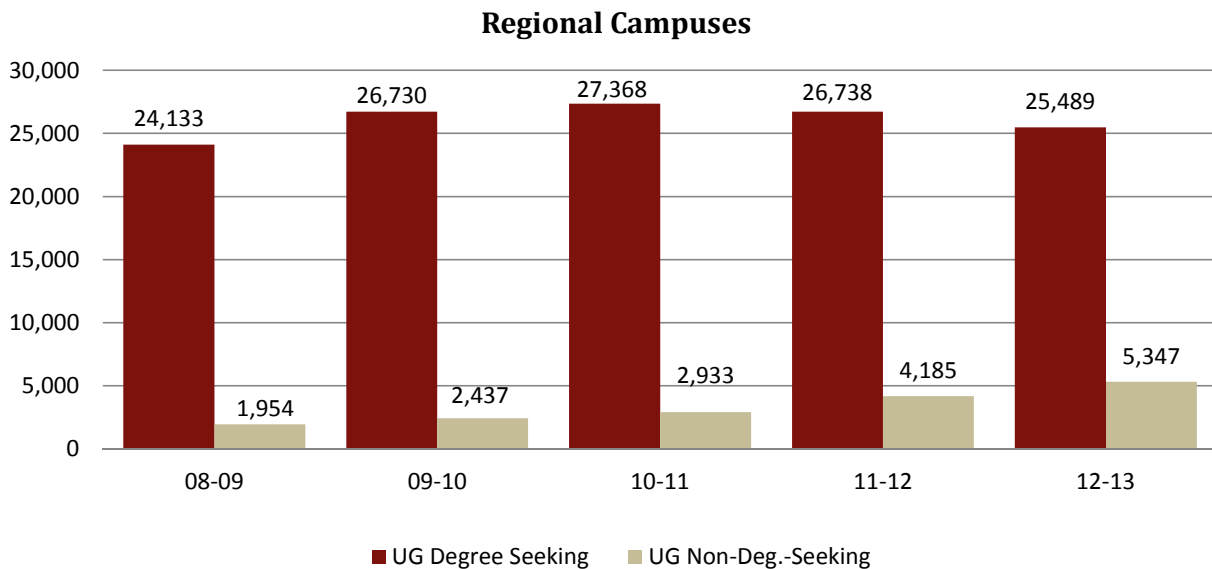

Degree-Seeking Undergraduates Compared to Non-Degree Undergraduates

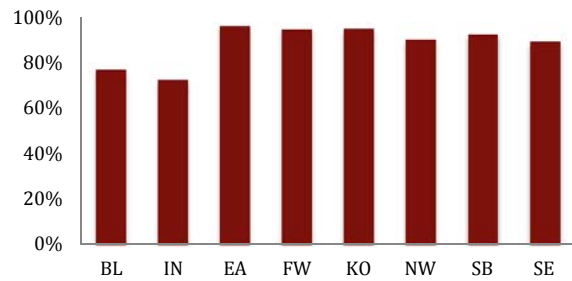

Percent of Total that is Undergraduate



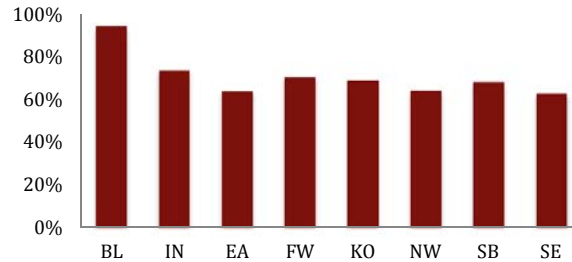

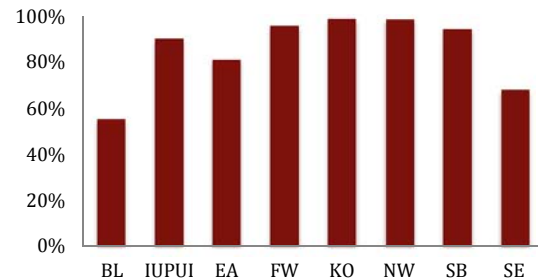
Percent of Undergraduate that is Full-time

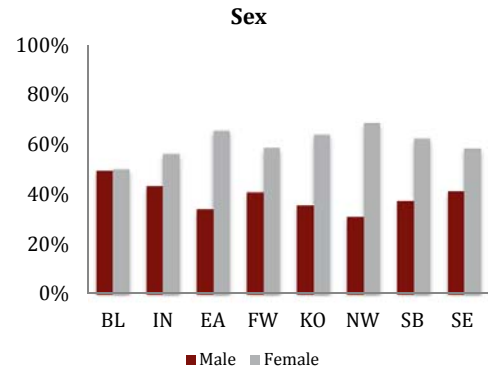

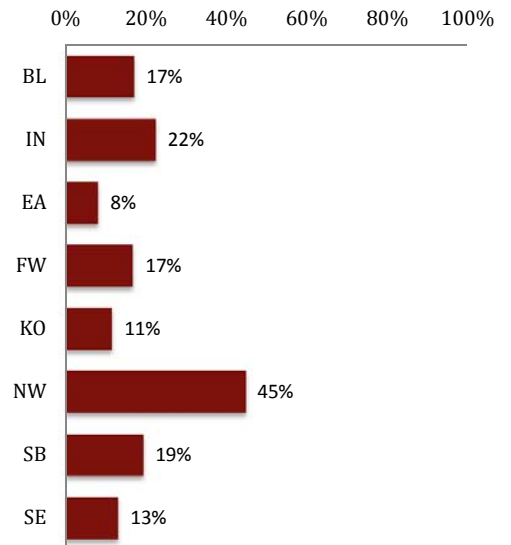

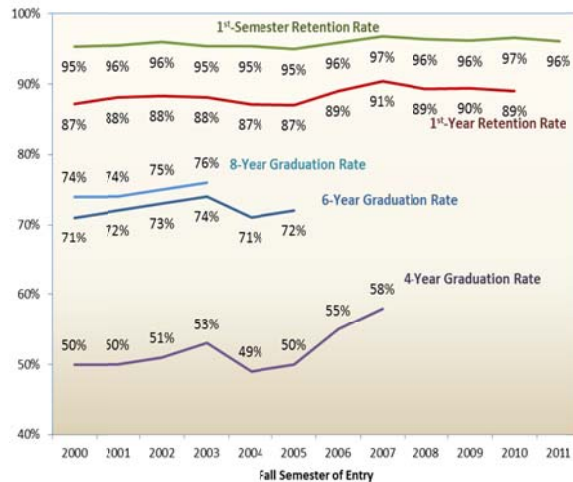
Understanding the Campus Panels

Retention & Graduation Rates

Various stakeholders and external groups require colleges and universities to calculate and supply data on retention and graduation rates. As a very public measure of our success at educating and credentialing students, these metrics provide a valued method of comparing institutions. Unfortunately, these measures rely on a cohort model of tracking; including only those incoming beginner students who were taking a full-time course load in the fall of the first semester. Regardless of what happens beyond the first semester, e.g. becoming part-time, these same students are “tracked” and reported on for years to come. For a residential campus like Bloomington this model is fairly representative. However, IUPUI and the regional campuses – because of the dynamic student populations they serve – do not compare well to residential campuses. Emerging models of reporting are attempting to provide a “fuller” picture of success for these students.

At IU we provide an inclusive view of activity within the university. The outcome of a student who starts at Kokomo but re-enrolls and/or receives a degree at IUPUI will be credited to the “home” campus of Kokomo. Historically, between 2 and 5% of our retention and graduation rates can be attributed to intercampus mobility.

Retention is typically measured by how many students return for a second year of education. This is defined as re-enrollment in the subsequent fall or completion of a degree. Because students may not make a two semester commitment to their education, retention to the second semester is a valid, intermediate measure of persistence. The first panel in this report compares these various measures for all the FT beginner cohorts since 2001.



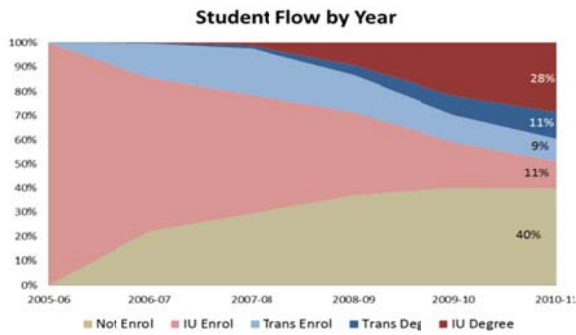
In the panels that follow the cohort includes *all* FT, beginner students - including those who intended to earn a certificate or associates degree. With external reporting, degrees are counted when they are completed within 150% of program length (i.e. 1.5 years for certificates; three years for associates; six years for baccalaureates). Hence, there may be slightly different graduation rate figures among the views as panel two only includes IU degrees earned within 150%, panel three looks at degrees earned by year, and panel four segregates degrees from IU and transfer institutions, both within and outside the 150% time parameter.

The second panel illustrates the standard six-year graduation rates for the 2006 cohort of FT beginners by a variety of student characteristics. These rates reflect any degrees earned within 150% of program length. The “Financial Aid Status” reflects proxy measures for low income (Pell) and middle income (Subsidized Loan, no Pell) students. For privacy purposes, if a cell contains fewer than ten students, ** will appear as the count although the percentage is still displayed.

Student Flow & Success Rates

The standard graduation rates measure reports on the success of students at the “home” or “originating” institution only, rendering a certain proportion of the outcomes as “unknown”. This standard practice fails to credit institutions for providing substantial preparation to the students who

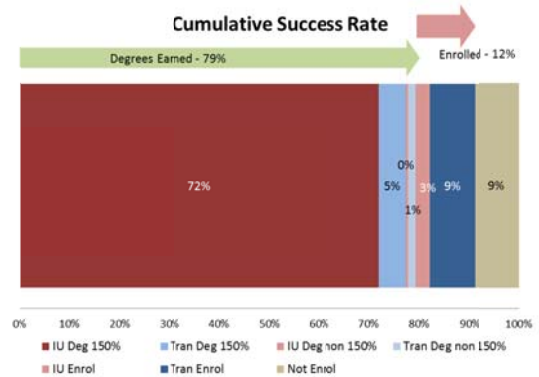


then choose to transfer elsewhere. Because of our participation in the Student Loan Clearinghouse, we have the capacity to match our students within this national database to determine subsequent enrollment or credentials received.

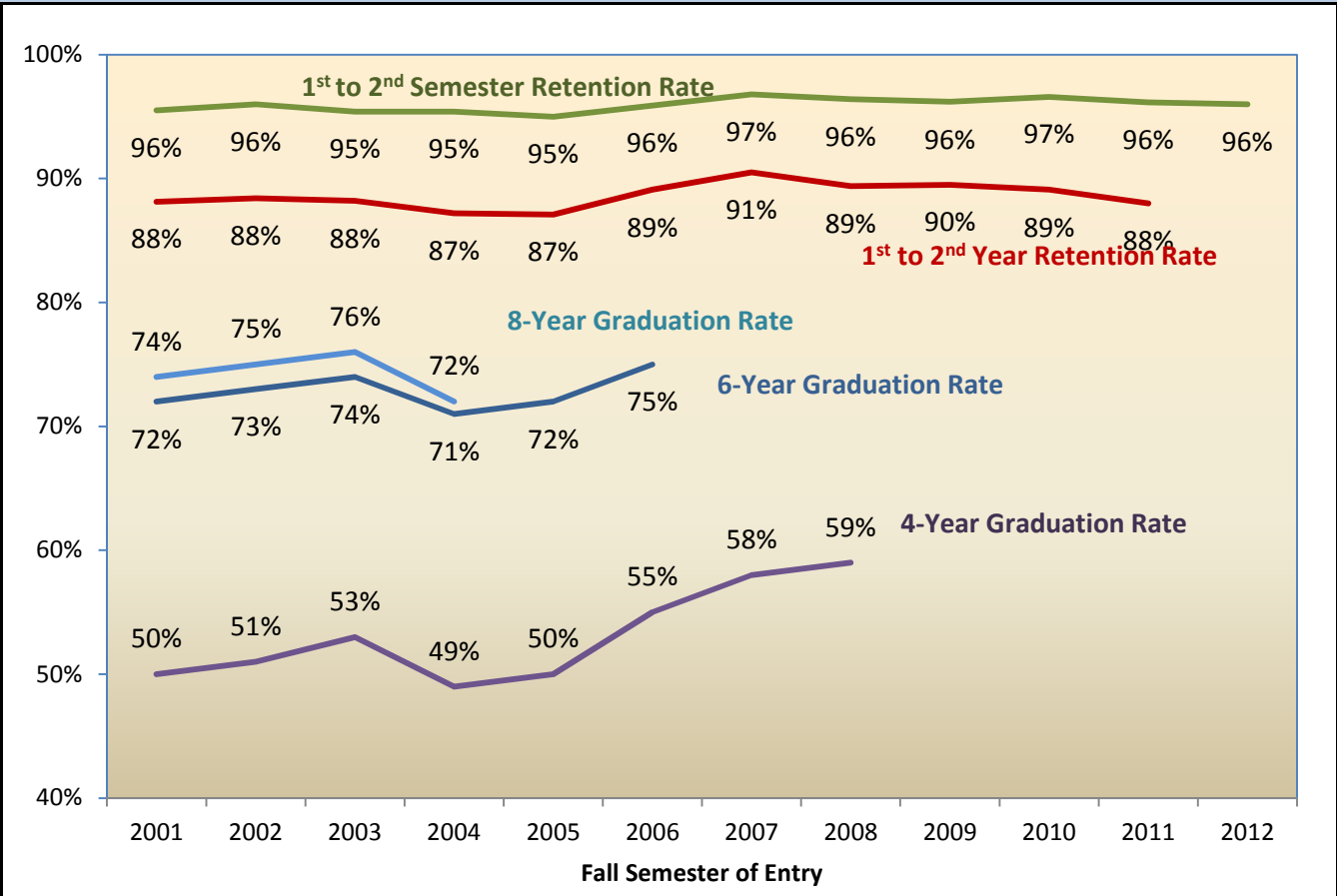
The “Student Flow by Year” panel reflects the year by year analysis of the cohort of students with degrees or enrollments at IU and elsewhere. Each year is a “snapshot” of the apportionment of students among the indicated statuses regardless of whether a degree was earned within 150% of program length.

In this view, the data represent the activity beyond graduates from IU to include transfer enrollments and transfer degrees. By accounting for all students from the cohort each year, the remainder or “not enrolled” reflects those students who did not receive a degree or were enrolled that year. For example, this chart that in the sixth year, 40% of these students in this cohort were neither enrolled nor had received a degree.

The final panel is a cumulative approach which segregates outcomes by degrees earned within and outside the 150% of program length. This view gives credit for any activity (enrollment or degrees) beyond the first year. For example, if a student re-enrolls at IU in the second year or transfers away but is not enrolled in year six, he or she is still counted as a positive outcome. In this manner, we can generate a “Success” rate that reflects IU or transfer credentials along with enrollments that constitute substantial preparation. This new view provides a fuller measure of our impact.



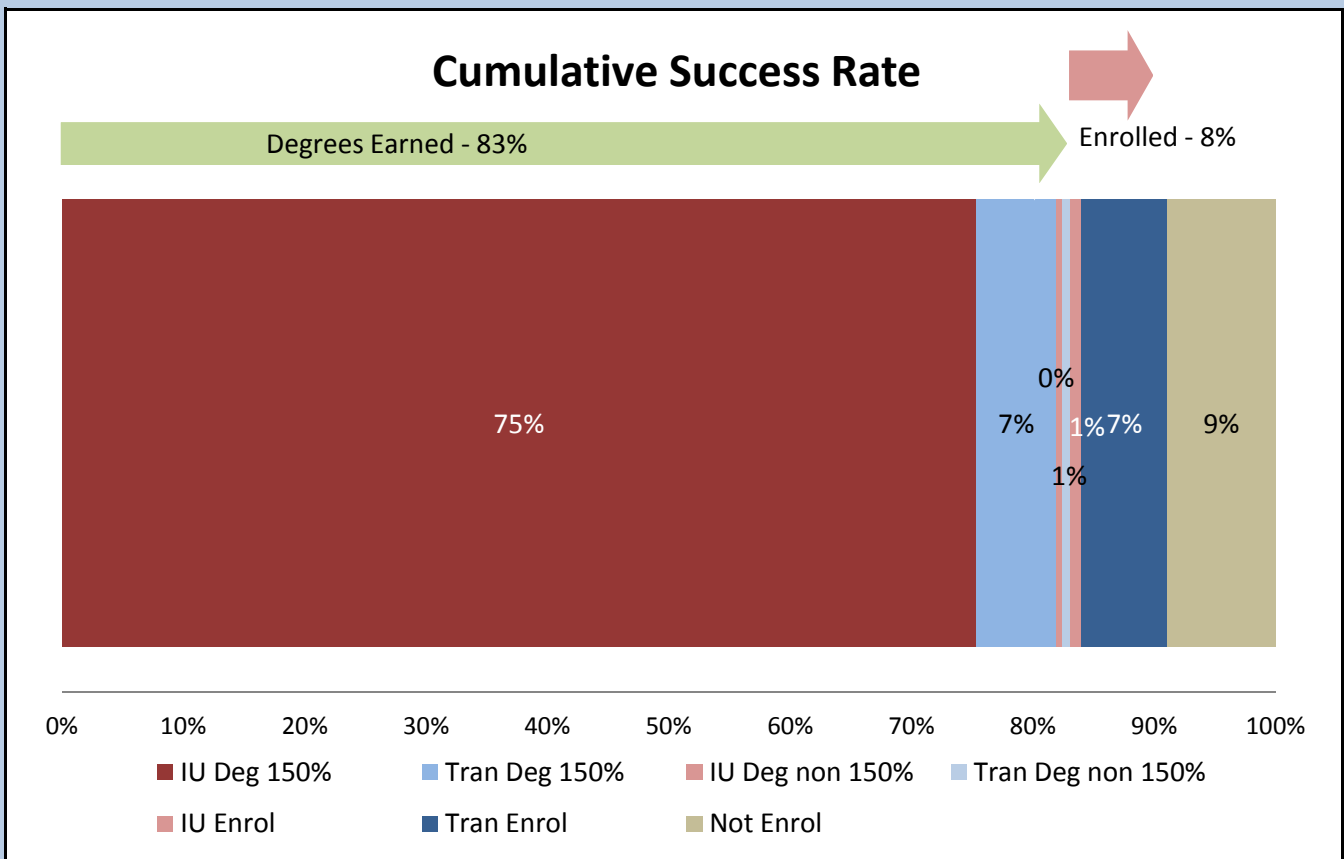
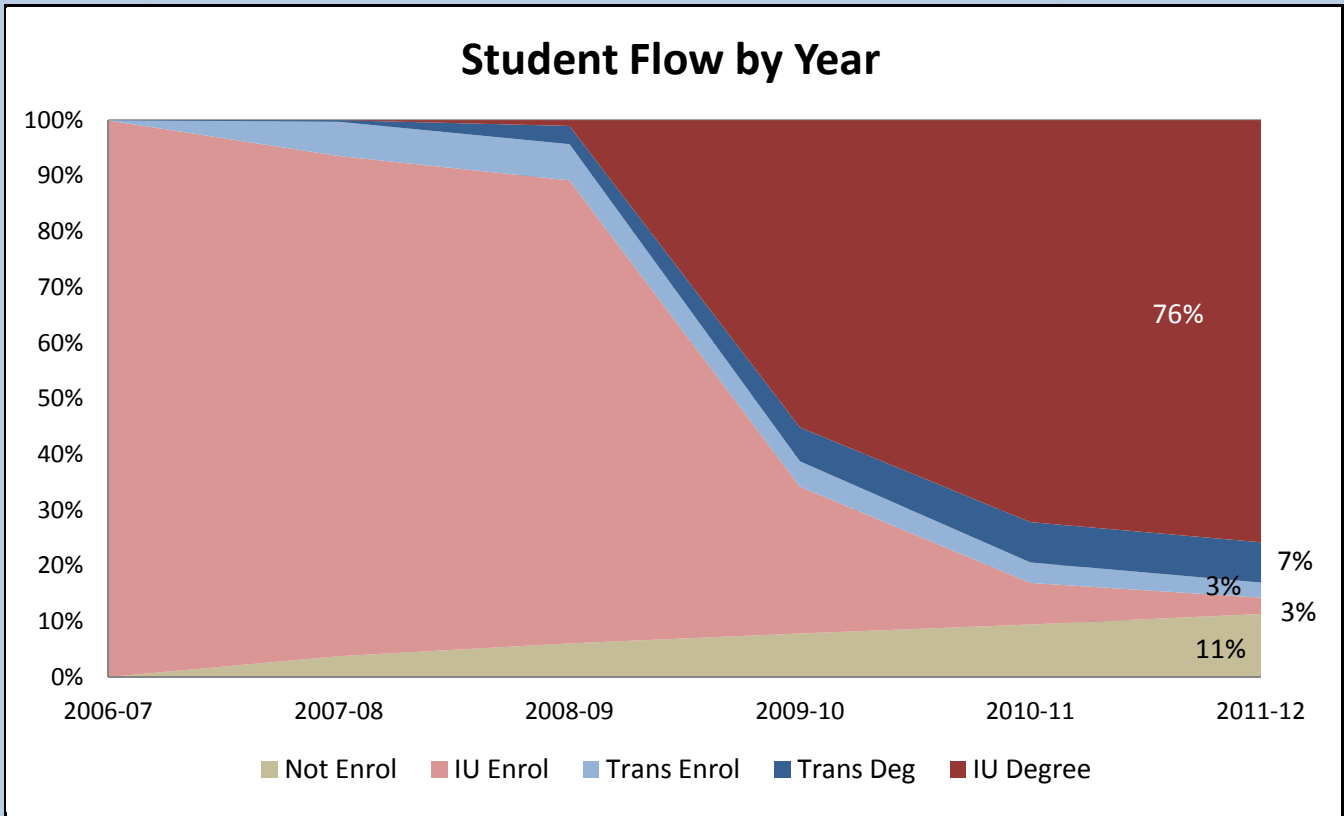
Bloomington - Retention & Graduation Rates



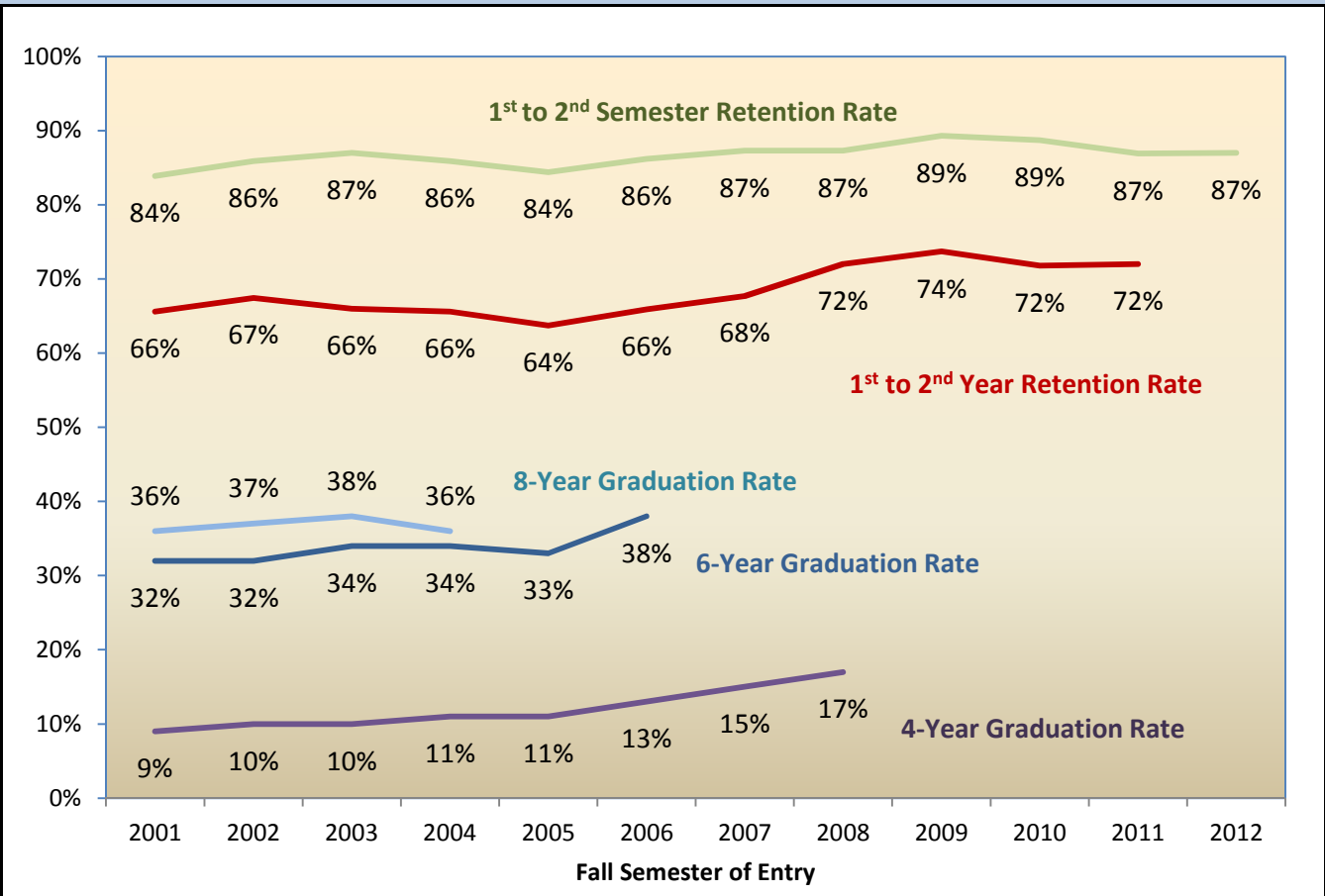

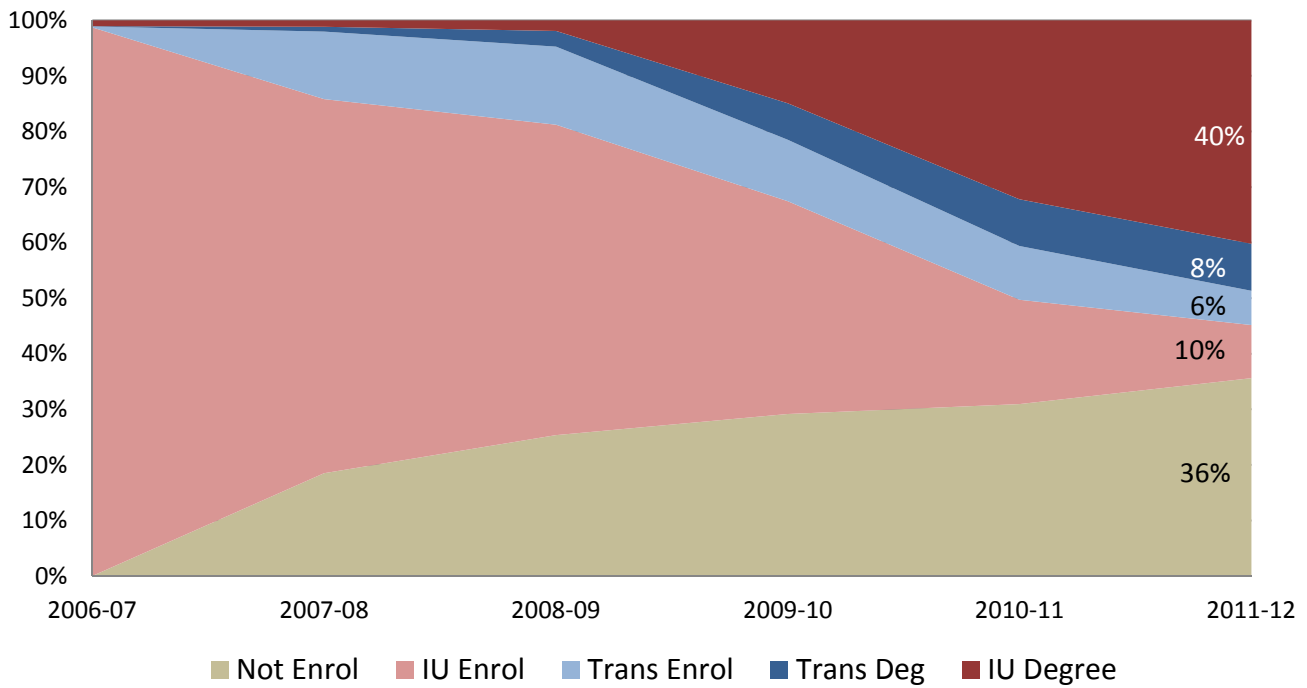

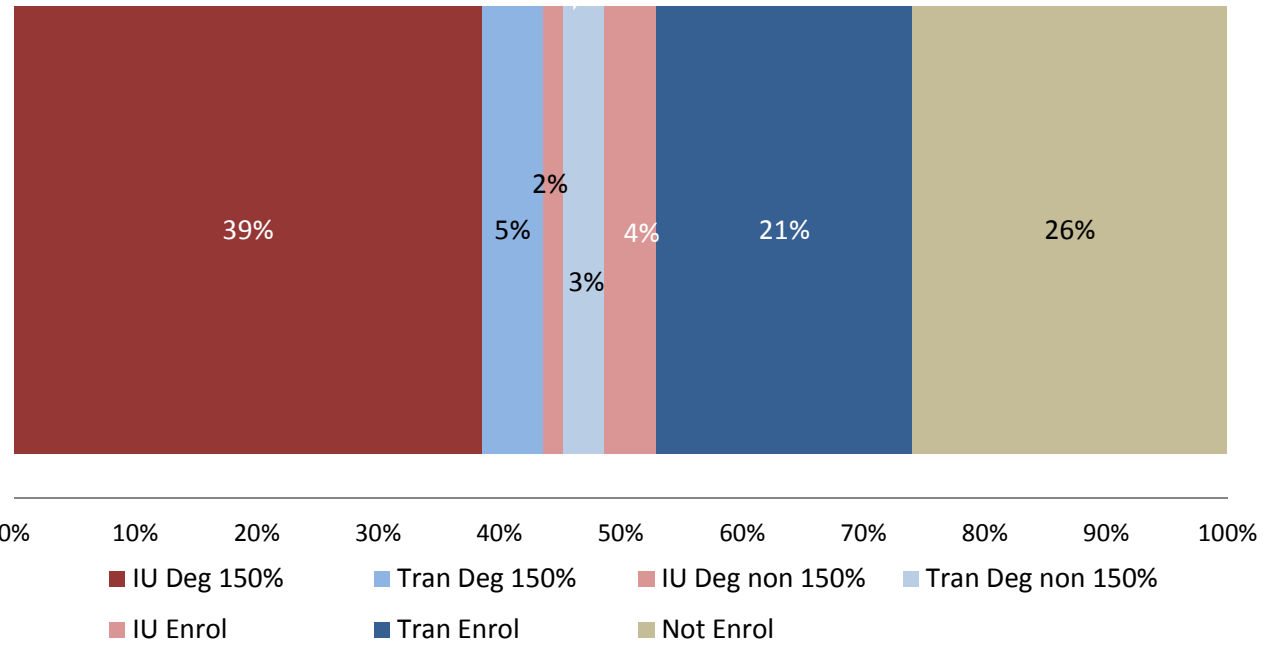

IUPUI - Student Flow & Success Rates - 2006 Cohort of FT Beginners

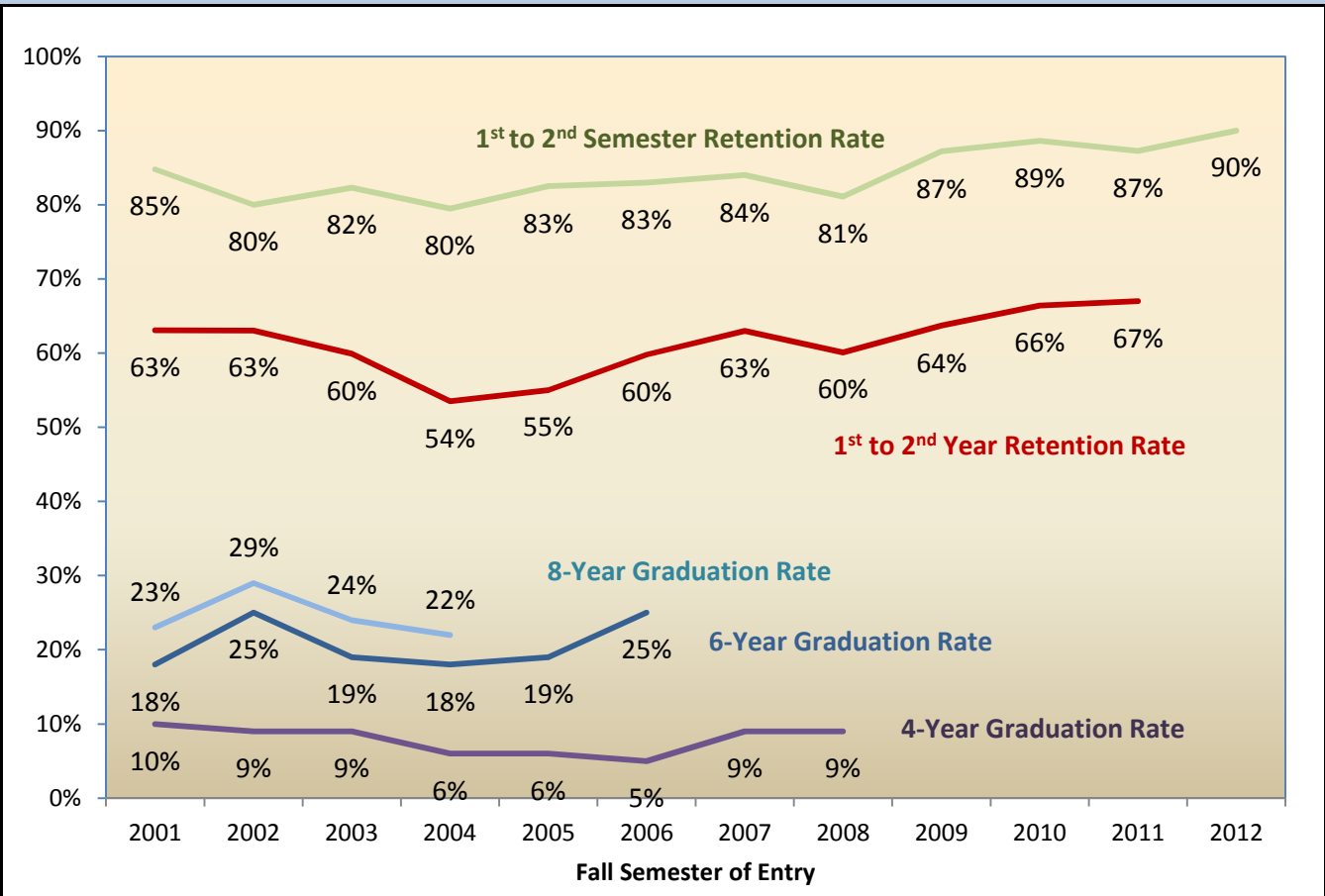
Student Flow by Year

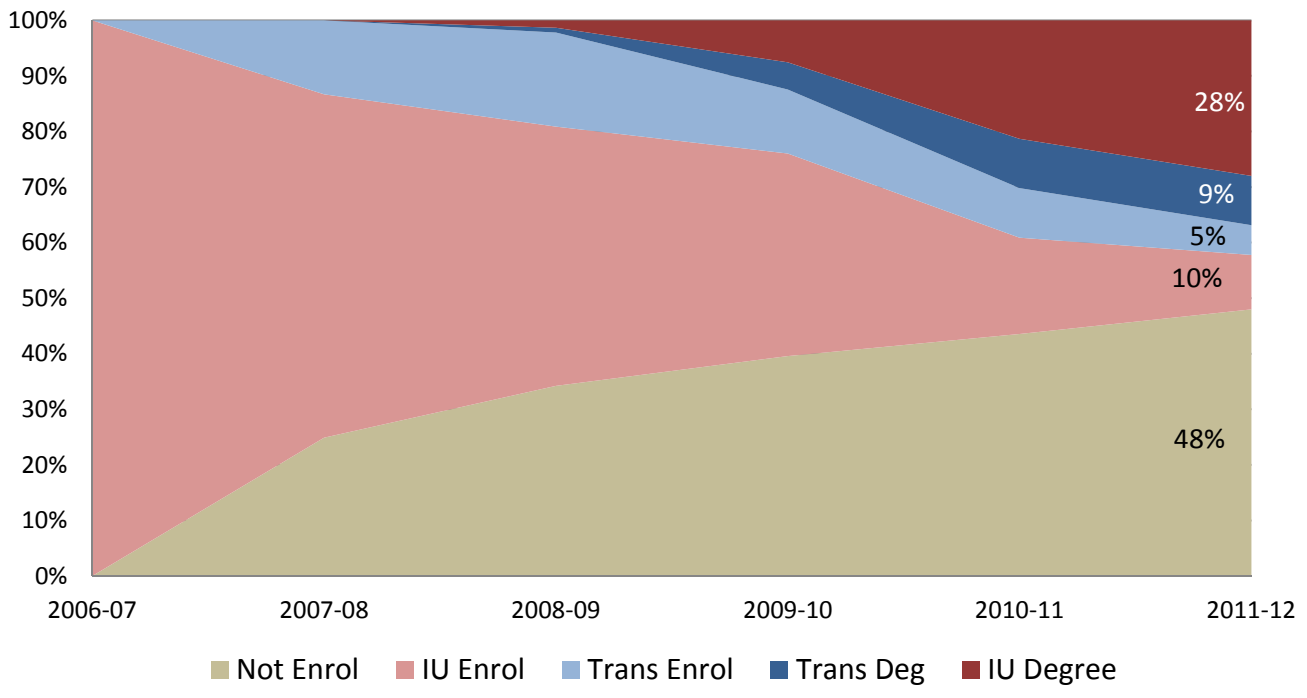

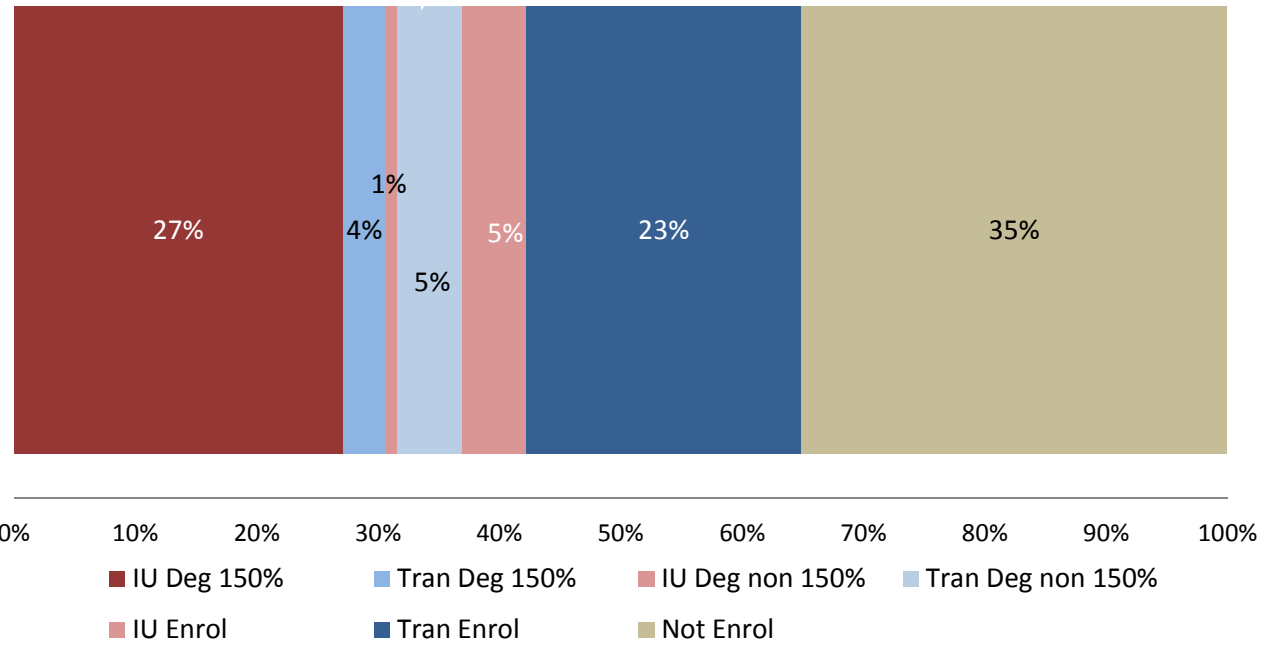

East - Student Flow & Success Rates - 2006 Cohort of FT Beginners

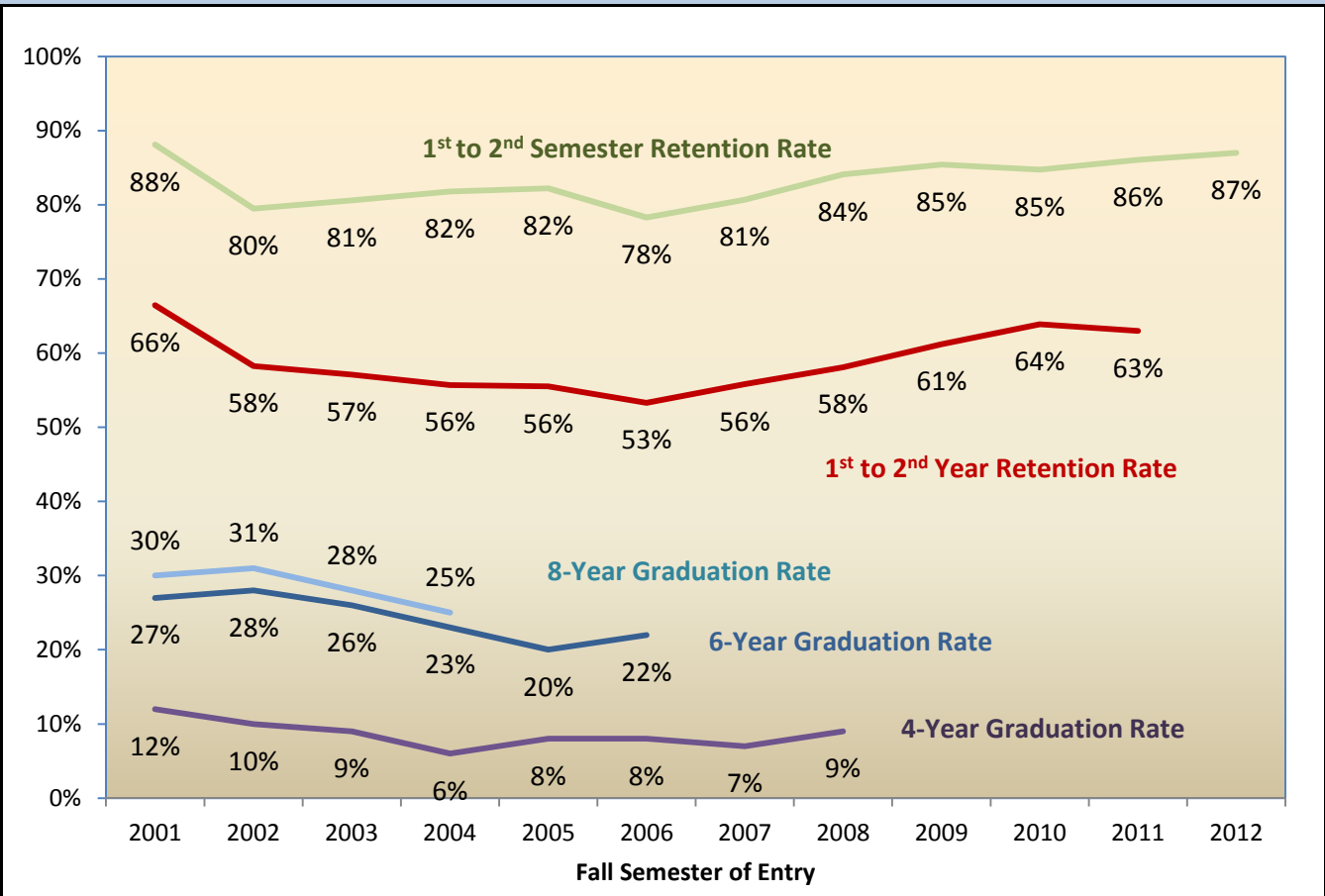
Student Flow by Year

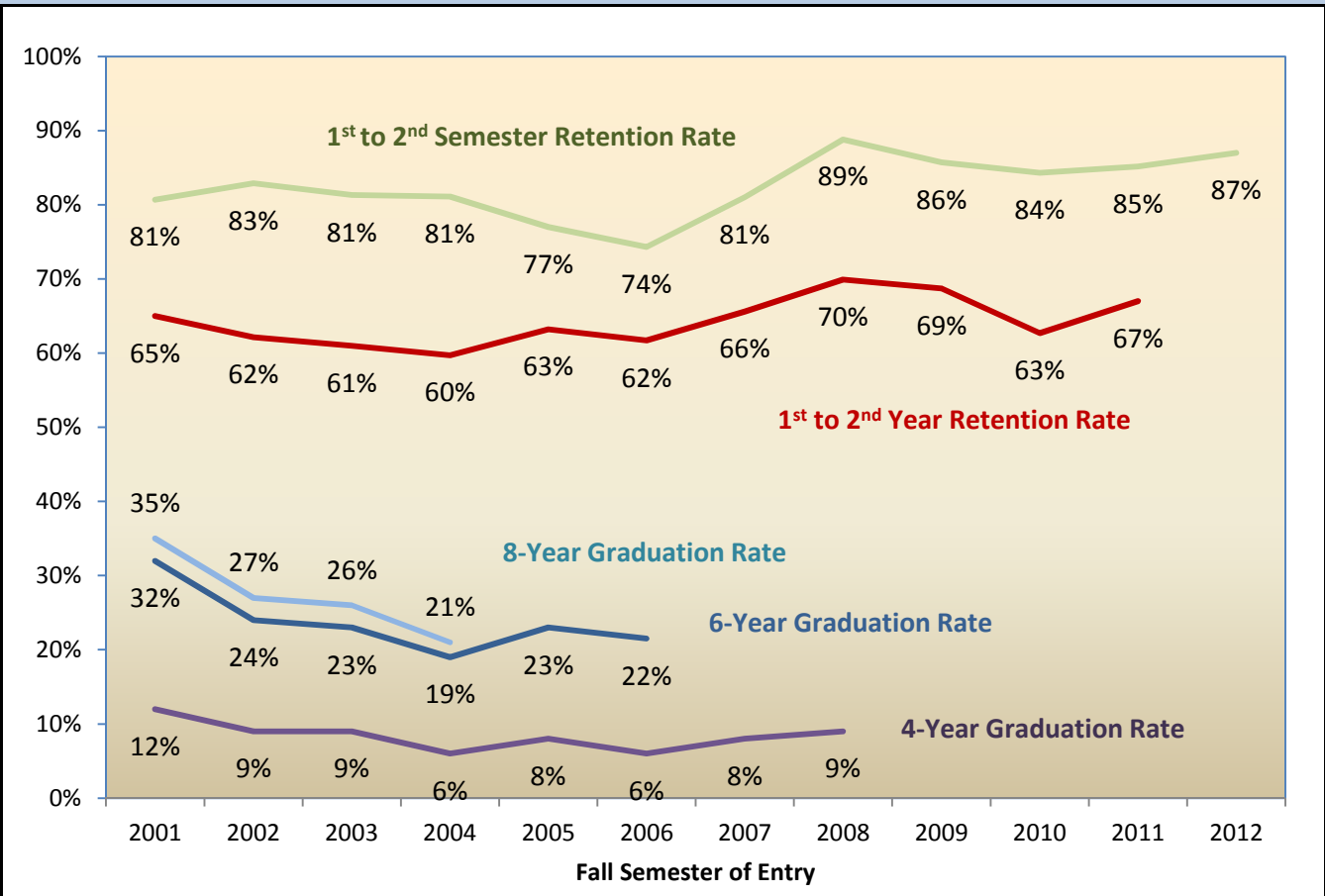

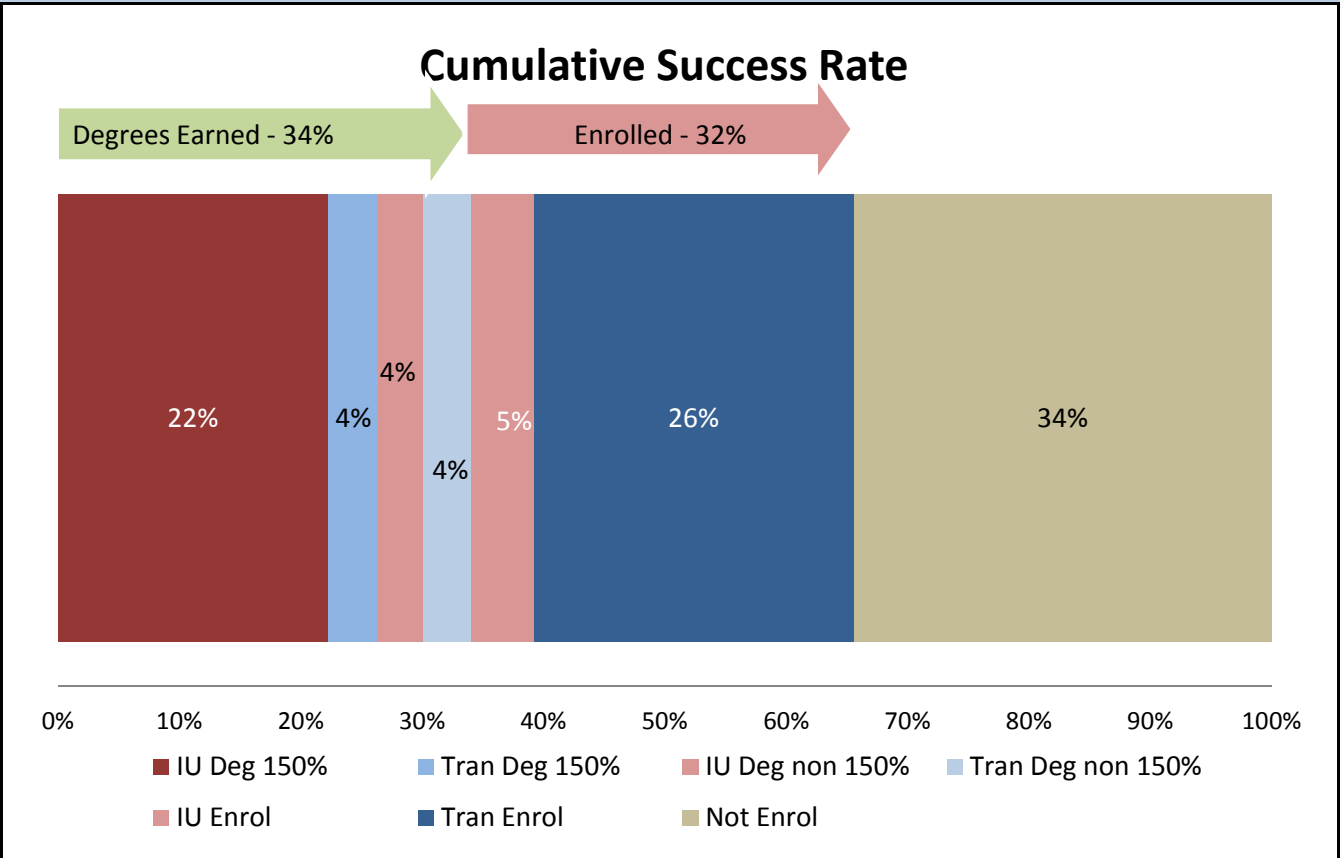

South Bend - Retention & Graduation Rates



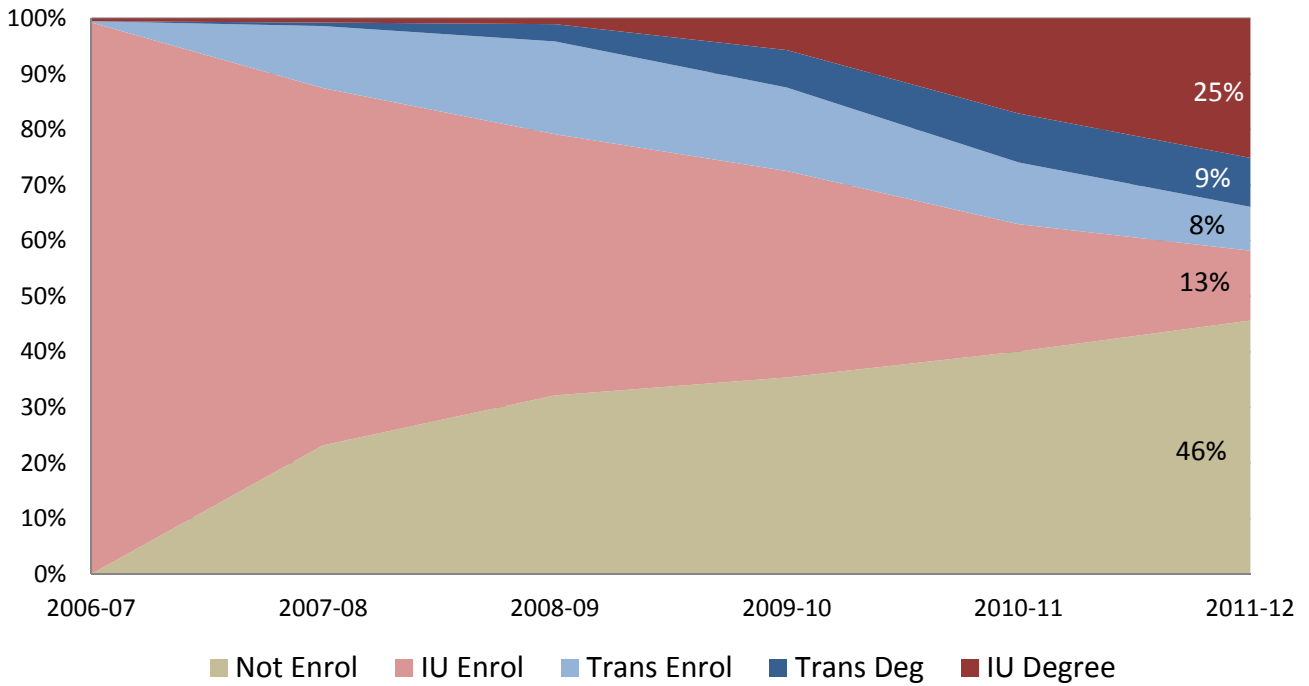

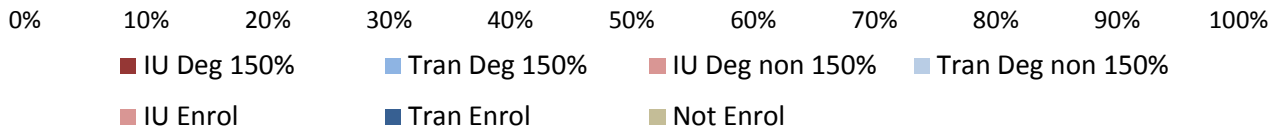
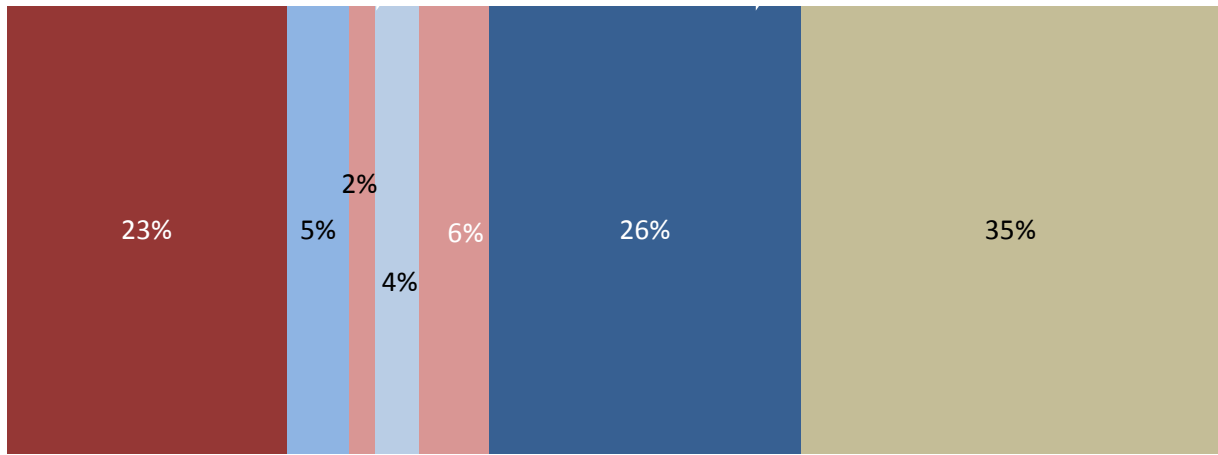

South Bend - Student Flow & Success Rates - 2006 Cohort of FT Beginners

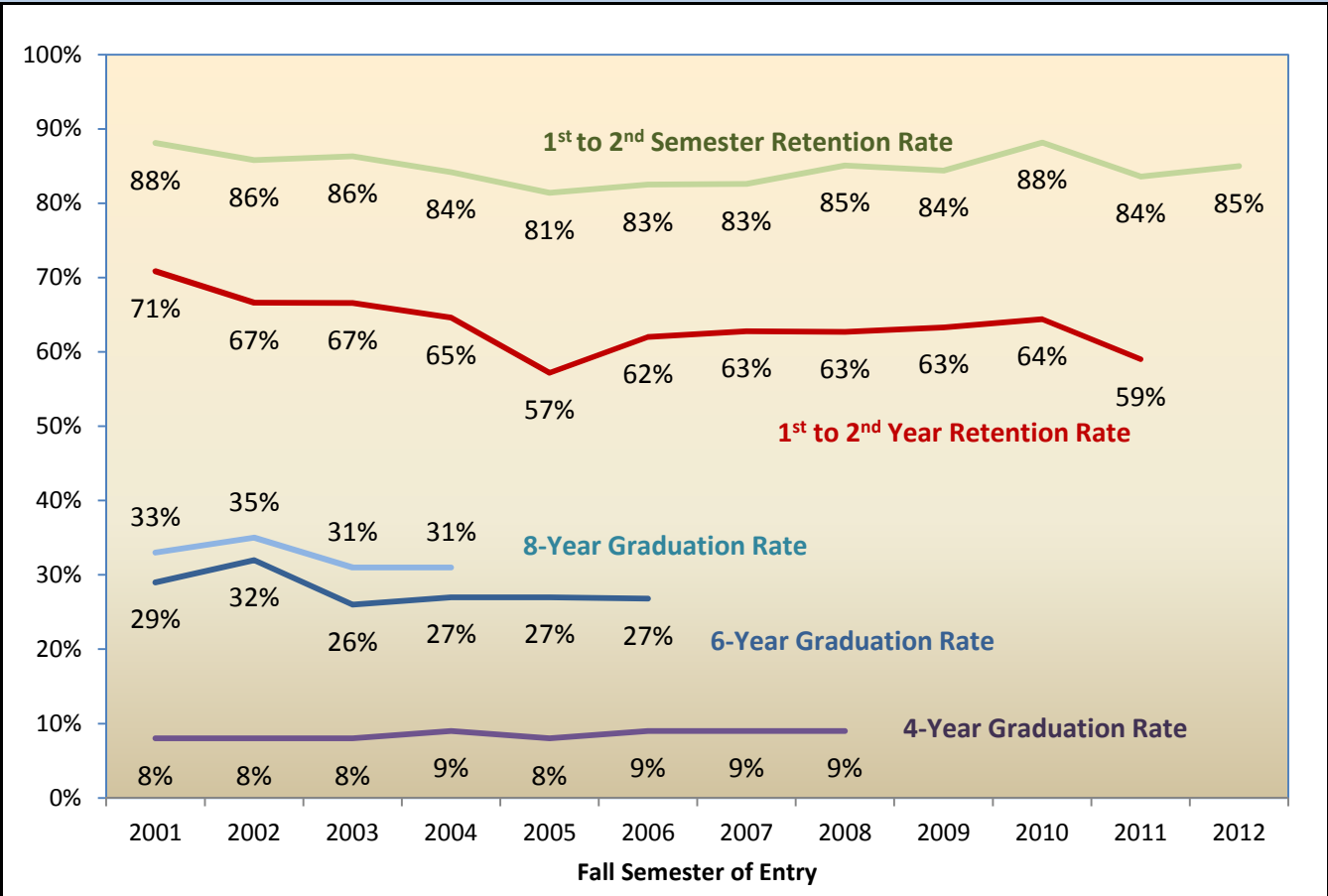
Student Flow by Year
